## EVENTS ATTENDED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN

From 18 October – 18 December<sup>1</sup>

### 18 October

The Chairman attended a photo shoot at the premises of her chosen charity, Second Time Around which will feature in the next edition of Cherwell Link.

### 19 October

The Chairman and Vice Chairman attended the annual opening of Banbury Fair where they used the power of the 'golden key' to give a free ride to local school children. This was done in conjunction with the Mayor of Banbury and the owner of the fair.

### 21 October

The Chairman attended the opening of Norbar Torque Tools facility on Wildmere Road. The event was also attended by Victoria Prentis MP and the Mayor of Banbury as well as a large number of delegates visiting from Norbar's international distribution network. The new facility is more than twice the size of the old premises and provides a positive and sustainable working environment for its 300 employees.
