PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide an outline of an application for the review of a Premises Licence in relation to G's, Deans Court, Bicester and detail the representations received from relevant authorities that has resulted in a hearing to determine the application.

Executive Summary

Introduction

- 1.1 On 23 July 2012, the Licensing Authority received an application for the review of the premises licence held in respect of G's, Deans Court, Bicester.
- 1.2 The Licensing Act 2003 provides a clear focus on the promotion of four statutory objectives which must be addressed when licensing functions are undertaken.

- 1.3 The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder.
 - Public safety.
 - The prevention of public nuisance.
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 1.4 The application was made by Laura Morris, Licensing Officer on behalf Thames Valley Police who are the Responsible Authority with responsibility for the Crime & Disorder objective under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.5 The application regards concerns that the Premises Licence Holders are not promoting the Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 1.6 A copy of the review application which gives details of the grounds for review and supporting documentation is to be found at **Appendix 1** of this report.
- 1.7 In accordance with the regulations of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Authority displayed the Notice of Review for a period of 28 days starting from the day after the date on which the application was served. The notice was displayed at the premises in question and at Cherwell District Council offices.
- 1.8 The consultation period for the review ended on 20 August 2012.
- 1.9 During the consultation period a response was received from Oxfordshire Trading Standards stating that they had no adverse comments to make. A copy of the response is attached as **Appendix 2** to this report.

Background Information

- 2.1 The current Premises Licence holder (PHL) is Mr George Samuel Smith of 23 Henley Avenue, Oxford, OX4 4DJ
- 2.2 The current Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) in respect of this premises licence is also Mr George Samuel Smith.
- 2.3 A copy of the current Premises Licence that is in force which gives details of the licensable activities permitted and the conditions attached to it is attached as **Appendix 3** to this report.
- 2.4 A location map of the premises is attached as **Appendix 5** to this report.
- 2.5 The premises licence first came into force on 24 November 2005, held by Mr George Smith. The licence was granted after an application was received under Grandfather Rights to convert and vary the various existing Justices and Public Entertainment Licences held in respect of the premises.
- 2.6 During the consultation period for the conversion and variation, Thames Valley Police, the Head of Environmental Health and one Interested Party, a local resident, made representations against the grant of the licence in relation to the negative impact upon the Crime and Disorder objective.
- 2.7 As a result of the representations being made, a hearing before the Licensing

Sub Committee was arranged to determine the application. In the period leading up to the hearing, negotiations took place between the applicant's solicitor, Thames Valley Police and the Head of Environmental Health where a number of conditions to be placed upon the licence were agreed.

- 2.8 The conditions related to the dates and times of events to take place, the management and security at the premises along with the arrangements for erotic entertainment at the premises.
- 2.9 The negotiated changes and proposed conditions were put to the Sub Committee who resolved to grant the application, with the relevant amendments to be made on 7 June 2005. The additional conditions were added to the premises licence and can be found at Annex 3, (pages 9 to 11) of **Appendix 3.** A copy of the minutes for the Sub-Committee hearing on the 7 June 2005 is attached at **Appendix 4** for reference.
- 2.10 Following the submittal of an operating schedule by Mr Smith in compliance with the conditions attached to the premises licence in November 2005, a new licence was issued in February 2006 permitting erotic entertainment at the premises. This operating schedule was incorporated into the premises licence that is attached to the report at **Appendix 3**.
- 2.11 On 20 June 2007, an application to vary the Premises Licence was submitted to the Licensing Team at Cherwell District Council on behalf of Mr Smith by Herbert Mallam Gowers Solicitors of Oxford. The application requested permission for erotic dancing on Wednesday nights in addition to the existing permission for Sunday nights from 9.00pm to 1.00am the following morning.
- 2.12 No objections were received in respect of the application and it was duly granted on 20 July 2007. The changes were incorporated into the premises licence that is attached to the report at **Appendix 3**.
- 2.13 In January 2008, following a meeting with Mr Smith and Thames Valley Police, a letter was sent to Mr Smith from the Senior Licensing Officer at Cherwell District Council regarding potential breaches of the premises licence. The premises had been brought to the attention of both Cherwell District Council and Thames Valley Police, giving both authorities cause for concern due to the following matters:
 - Sale of alcohol to underage persons
 - Sale of alcohol to intoxicated persons
 - Failure to complete the incident log
 - Behaviour of the door supervisors
 - General management of the premises.

The result of the letter was a formal request for an action plan to be submitted by Mr Smith addressing the concerns raised by both authorities to prevent any further formal action being taken against him. A copy of the letter sent to Mr Smith by Cherwell District Council can be found at **Appendix 6** to this report.

2.14 After further liaisons with both authorities, an action plan was submitted. In

addition to this, Thames Valley Police placed an 8 week probationary period upon the premises to enable them to implement the action plan and improve the management of the premises. The probationary period ended on 7 May 2008. The finalised action plan and supporting documents was submitted by Mr Smith to the Licensing Officer at Thames Valley Police.

- 2.15 In September 2008, a meeting was held between Thames Valley Police and Mr Smith, following a number of incidents occurring at the premises.
 Correspondence between Thames Valley Police and Mr Smith is included in the application for review, at **Appendix 1.**
- 2.16 On 14 December 2011, the Licensing Team received a letter from the Rt Hon Andrew Smith MP requesting clarification on the powers of the Police and the permissions of Mr Smiths licence. The letter, along with the response from Natasha Barnes, is attached as **Appendix 7**.
- 2.17 In January 2012, it was brought to the attention of the Licensing Team that no payment in lieu of the annual fees for G's had been received. Payment was due by 23 November 2011. Through discussions with the Licensing and Vehicle Parks Manager, an arrangement was made for payment to be made by Mr Smith to avoid formal recovery being put in place. Any future non payments may result in the suspension of the premises licence in accordance with the regulations.
- 2.18 In March 2012, Mr Smith notified the Licensing Team of his intention to use one of his eight annual permissions to extend his opening hours until 04:00 hours from Saturday 24 March into Sunday 25 March, in accordance with the conditions upon his premises licence. The notification was acknowledged by the Licensing Team and Laura Morris of Thames Valley Police on 19 March 2012.
- 2.19 On 23 April 2012, Mr Smith submitted an application for a minor variation to the premises licence, proposing a condition be added to the premises licence restricting the latest entry time on Friday and Saturday nights to 02:15 hours the following morning. This application was granted on 7 June 2012 following negotiations between Mr Smith's solicitors, HMG Law, and Thames Valley Police. The premises licence was updated accordingly and the changes put into effect. All changes have been included in the copy of the premises licence attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.20 On 23 July 2012, Cherwell District Council Licensing Team received notice of an application for the review of the premises licence held by G's Wine Bar from the Chief Constable of Thames Valley Police. The full application, including all of its appendices, is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.21 Thames Valley Police have applied for the review of the premises licence in relation to the promotion of the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder the protection of public safety.
- 2.22 In the application, Thames Valley Police have made the following statement in relation to the grounds for review:

Thames Valley Police are calling for review of this licence due to the premise not upholding the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety objectives of the 2003 Licensing Act.

There are concerns that the premise is unable to effectively control and monitor its customers. The level of intoxication of its customers is unable to be monitored effectively by staff and this then result in disorder inside and outside of the premise. The door staff regularly fails to intervene early in order to prevent instances from escalating.

37% of the premises incidents involved some form of disorder and 19% involved assaults, with the majority of these incidents occurring after 1am.

- 2.23 Further supporting information is included in the application at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.24 On 1 August 2012, Oxfordshire Fire & Rescue Service carried out an audit of safety measures in relation to fire risk at G's Wine Bar and found a number of deficiencies which were notified to the Licensing Officer at Thames Valley Police. The deficiencies will be dealt with under the Fire Service's own regulatory powers to avoid any duplications of legislation. An email detailing all of the deficiencies is attached at **Appendix 8.**
- 2.25 In the email from Oxfordshire Fire Service, potential breaches of the premises licence in relation to the number of door staff in operation was also mentioned. As a result, checks of the premises were carried out by Thames Valley Police in case of any breaches taking place. As a result, it was discovered that only two door staff were on duty and not the required four. As a result, a letter was sent by the Licensing Team Leader at Cherwell District Council regarding the breaches and advising of future actions should further breaches occur. A copy of this letter is attached at **Appendix 9.**

Key Issues for Consideration/Reasons for Decision and Options

- 3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 states that all licensing matters must promote the four Licensing Objectives, they are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety:
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

Each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the promotion of the four objectives is paramount considerations at all times. However, the legislation also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work. They include:

 Protecting the public and local residents from crime, anti-social behaviour and noise nuisance caused by irresponsible licensed premises;

- Giving the police and licensing authorities the powers they need to effectively manage and police the night-time economy and take action against those premises that are causing problems;
- Recognising the important role which pubs and other licensed premises play in our local communities by minimising the regulatory burden on business, encouraging innovation and supporting responsible premises;
- Providing a regulatory framework for alcohol which reflects the needs of local communities and empowers local authorities to make and enforce decisions about the most appropriate licensing strategies for their local area; and
- Encouraging greater community involvement in licensing decisions and giving local residents the opportunity to have their say regarding licensing decisions that may impact upon them.

- (b) If the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of."

Schedule 5 of the Act, Section 9 Paragraph 2 states

"An appeal under this Part must be commenced by notice of appeal given by the appellant to the justices' chief executive for the magistrates' court within the period of 21 days...."

Therefore any decisions taken at the Review Hearing by the Licensing Sub-Committee will not take effect until the period within which an appeal can be brought has passed, and then following which until the determination of any such appeal.

Thames Valley Police have great concerns about the conduct of the premise and have tried many options in order to reduce the incidents. The premise tends to reduce its incidents when initial action plans and meetings are held but once this is effective and police reduce its focus the incidents again creep up. This is evidenced in Annex 3 G's timeline.

The incident spread sheet in Annex 1 shows all the incidents at the premise since the new Licence came into force in 2005. The last column on this sheet states whether the premise has been proactive or not in dealing with these incidents. Since 2005 the premise has been proactive in 79 incidents not proactive in 87 incidents and indifferent in 132. In the last year alone there have been 16 proactive incidents not proactive in 24 and 19 unknown. In Annex 6 you can see the comparisons to other premises in relation to incidents and proactivity. Thames Valley Police find this unacceptable for a licensed premise to have so many instances in which they are not being proactive and feel this is a contrary to the crime and disorder objective of the 2003 act.

On the 7th May this year a minor variation was sought by the premise following advice from Thames Valley Police this variation was to restrict the last entry time in the hope that this would help the premise monitor the levels of intoxication and disorder. We have found that this is not being strictly adhered to and officers are having to closely monitor the premise in order to ensure this is adhered to. There have been instances (shown in Annex 1) since this has been put into place where by door staff have stated that police are the reason that this is in place which then causes members of the public to accost officers and has created instances of disorder. This is seen as highly unprofessional when it is a condition on their licence and their responsibility to monitor it.

In a meeting in December 2011 it was discussed that the premise does not regularly attend pub watch meetings. It would be expected as a member of pub watch that the persons causing issues in the premise would be put forward to pub watch in order to take the stance that the rest of the town has in banning persons who cause disorder. This also shows poor management on the part of the premise as they are not utilising all the options available to them.

There recently has been issues with the premise using its radio this is evidenced in several meetings held over January this year where by the radio was not working then it was on the wrong channel and then there were complaints when it was not being monitored. Those ejected from other premises are being allowed entry and officers are having to monitor this rather than the premise taking responsibility

Thames Valley Police feel that due to previous interventions that have been put into place that have not eradicated the issues the only option now open to us is to recommend revocation of the premise licence.







The application submitted set out variations to the premises license which were summarised as follows:-

- (i) persons to be admitted who were aged 18 and above upon production of evidence of age and identity in the form only of passport or driving licence;
- (ii) hours of licensable activities to be extended on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays to 2.00 am and on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays to 4.00 am

and on Sundays to 1.00 am except when the Sunday is followed by a bank holiday when the extensions shall be to 4.00 am;

(iii) last admission to be one hour before licensable activities ceases; and

(iv) provision of dancing entertainment.

Mr Butterfield the solicitor for the applicant indicated that following discussions with the Police and the Head of Environmental Services conditions have now been agreed they were acceptable to both the applicant and the responsible authorities.

Mr Butterfield addressed the Sub-Committee on the objections made by Mr Bone.

Police confirmed that they had now agreed to conditions which:-

extended licensable activities on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and on Sundays which were followed by a bank holiday Monday to 3.00 am and not 4.00 am as originally requested. On eight occasions a year an extension of licensable activities would be agreed until 4.00 am provided in each case 28 days notice was given to the Police;

(ii) restricted admission after 1.00 am;

(iii) required persons aged 18 and above to be admitted to the premises in accordance with CD28 of the pool of conditions

The Head of Environmental Services confirmed that he had agreed to erotic dances being undertaken on one night per week subject to the following condition:-

"No regulated entertainment involving erotic dancing shall take place until a detailed operating schedule describing how the activities shall comply with relevant conditions with the Council's pool of conditions has been submitted in writing for approval by the Licensing Authority. The activity shall be carried out in accordance with the approved operating schedule."

The Head of Environmental Services stated that in the event of the applicant not agreeing to the conditions set out by the Licensing Authority this would be referred to the Sub-Committee for determination.

Mr Bone, speaking as an interested party, indicated the problems that he suffered as a local resident and his concerns regarding the likely exacerbation of that situation by an extension in operating hours.

The Sub-Committee then retired to consider the application. Upon the return of the Sub-Committee it was

RESOLVED that the variation to the premises licence now requested be agreed, subject to additional conditions indicated to the Sub-Committee by the Police and the Head of Environmental Services.

Reason: the Sub-Committee is not satisfied from the evidence it has heard, that the hours sought should not be granted.

6. END OF PROCEEDINGS

The proceedings ended at 11.05 am.

Dear George,

Further to our conversation and off the back of a phone call with Natasha from Cherwell district council today, I just want to reiterate our positions so all parties know where they stand.

I require from you a revised action plan that covers in detail steps on how you intend to tackle the issues discussed in the meeting we held at G's on the 25th of January, as the action plan submitted previously (see attached) was not detailed enough.

I would also like any training package for staff and doors staff to be copied to both Thames Valley Police and Cherwell District Council for approval.

I am concerned that you decided to stick with Hurricane security but was relieved to hear that the named door supervisor involved in the vicious attack has been removed. Needless to say I have contacted SIA to investigate this matter. I am still worried about the decision to keep the other three doors staff on. I feel, despite them saying they were aiding an officer the use of force/attack by the door staff was completely disproportionate to the report made by the officer and urge you to arrange replacements as this incident may very well occur again if they are going to be that 'hot headed'.

I feel I must be blunt with you I will require this to be done by Friday the 15th of February (next Friday) as the nature of the incidents that have drawn your premises to the attention of this office are very serious and it is now two weeks since our meeting and I still do not have a action plan of sufficient merit to show to my Inspector to demonstrate to him that you are cooperating with us in resolving these issues. I also urge you (as above) to reconsider the door staff issue as for us this is of key importance and affect how the TVP proceed from here with regard to your licence.

There are a number of initiatives that the Thames Valley Police are willing to offer such as having our drugs detection machine (itemiser) out for the evening on your door as a condition of entry, which would be a good publicity opportunity for you in the local press and would help to reassure us that your are sincere in trying to deter the more anti social elements of the Bicester area form your site and thus helping to prevent other associated anti social issues such as the fighting in market square which has been linked to G's.

Should you require any further help please do not hesitate to get in touch with either myself or Natasha at Cherwell D.C

On 24th September 2008, I visited your premises accompanied by PC Nicki Entwhistle, PC Vicki Lees, Tony Hodgson of Cherwell district council and Alex Bloomfield TVP licensing. The purpose of our visit was to highlight that certain issues seem to be occurring on a more regular basis and we would like to work with you to prevent this before it escalates.

During the meeting the following suggestions were made to you, in an effort to protect your premises licence from coming under scrutiny:

- Put more detail in your incident book. We need times, descriptions, who called the police, which officers attended etc.
- Call the police if an incident occurs and get a URN number and record it in your incident book. Use 999's if occurring at that moment and urgent assistance is needed, use 0845 8505 505 if you need to log it for our information.
- Consider how you are ejecting your customers. Stagger the ejections try to head them in different directions.
- Vaseline to be used on all appropriate surfaces in all toilets to prevent drug taking. Try to keep it down all the time; if cleaning old Vaseline off, replace it immediately.
- Ensure that if anyone from Police or council visit your premises that they are signing your book and that all is in order.

Hopefully this will help to prevent any further incidents from occurring or if anything does occur it will be handled in an appropriate manner that does not affect your licence. This letter has been issued as an initial warning, to show the seriousness of the anti social behaviour that has been occurring as a result of your premises.

All youths entering the premises must be search prior to entry. The searches are primarily undertaken to prevent weapons, alcohol, cigarettes and illegal substances being brought into the venue. Any person that refuses to be searched will not be permitted to attend the event.

These events will be ticket only events and no tickets will be sold on the door and all conditions of entry will be clearly stated on the ticket

The Front of the premises must be swept of all glass prior to the event beginning

When issuing tickets parental consent and contact details must be taken and put onto the guest list to prevent tickets being brought on behalf of others.

The event will run no later than 23.00 hours

A Member of door staff must be present at the pick up point from 22.30 until all have dispursed.

A telephone must be made readily available for youths to call their parents should such a situation arise.

It has been agreed at this meeting that in order to combat against the number of incidents occurring at your premise that you are going to implement the following.

- CCTV recovery of CCTV has been an issue due to an upgrade of the system being carried out and teething problems from this. This has now been rectified and will now download straight to disc. If an issue does occur in the future the licensing department will be notified with an approximate date for it to be fixed. It was suggested that another person is to be trained on how the system works so that if George is not there to download footage then evidence will still be available to be seen and copied. It was stated at the meeting that CCTV recording is now only kept for 24 days I must reiterate that this is a breach of licence as your licence condition states it will be kept for a minimum of 28 days.
- The night net radio is to be carried at all times that the premise is open. This is to ensure that all messages from other premises are heard and noted.
- There have been occasions when door staff and staff should have been more vigilant with letting those who are drunk into the premise and also letting people leave the premise with glasses/bottles.
- It was also suggested that the smoking area be made more contained so to prevent disorder with those in the queue and prevent objects being passed over to those who are already in the premise.
- Those persons who do leave the premise must be researched/assessed when reentering the premise.
- Any major incidents or issues the premise will report to the licensing team via phone or email at the next available opportunity so that both sides of the incident are recorded for the file.

On the evening of 21st May 2010, a Test Purchasing Operation was carried out by Thames Valley Police, in Bicester.

Unfortunately your premises failed the test, and alcohol was served to two young females, aged fifteen years. Two bottles of WKD blue were sold by a member of bar staff.

It is an offence under the Licensing Act 2003, sections 146 - 147, to sell or allow the sale of alcohol to anyone under the age of eighteen years. The penalty for this can be up to £5000 fine.

The offence committed on the evening of 21st May was dealt with via a Fixed Penalty notice of £80 to the person who made the sale. At this time, the Police will not seek a prosecution against the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS), George Smith. However, the Licensing Authority at Cherwell District Council will be informed of the offence.

As this is the first occasion that the premises have failed a Test Purchase, it can now be seen that this is an initial warning, and that any future failures will be met with a more robust response. This will in the form of an Application to Review the License and/or a prosecution under the Licensing Act 2003.

Licensing meeting with George Smith from G's, wine bar.

On Wednesday 16th November 2011 Mr George Smith licence and owner of G's wine bar was invited into the police station to discuss recent issues the police had been involved in concerning his establishment.

Inspector Hibbert discussed the issue of a 16 year old using false ID to gain entry into his premise whilst drunk. The youth was then identified by a family member and was asked to show her ID again to door staff this time with a UV light confirming that the ID was fake. The underage female was then asked to leave and in doing so punched a customer. Mr Smith tried to make the point that it was good ID and hard to tell the difference. PS Entwistle highlighted the fact that if door staff had used the UV light on the initial entry the 16 year old would not have been granted permission to enter in the first place. Mr Smith was advised to use the UV light on everyone who enters his premise in order to stop incidents like this happening again. It was explained that this should be a condition of entry. Mr Smith appeared to accept this view.

Inspector Hibbert highlighted the fact that the police had several incidents relating to G's involving disorder. Inspector Hibbert informed Mr Smith that the police were considering taking his premise to a licensing panel for review, due to these incidents and offered a way of tackling this issue. Inspector Hibbert discussed with Mr Smith other licensing conditions of entry, and suggested that Mr Smith Shuts his doors at 0100hrs to customers therefore trying to stop customers entering his premise late on in the evening who are already intoxicated from other establishments within the town centre.

Mr Smith felt that his business would go under if this condition was imposed on him, and thought he could try it at 0200hrs. Inspector Hibbert and Sergeant Entwistle explained that by imposing this condition could benefit his business as he would have customers who wanted to be at his premise and knowing they had to be in before 0100hrs, would therefore spend more money, and not just getting in to get last orders, which is what is happening now.

Inspector Hibbert explained that Mr Smith has a duty of care to his customers on leaving his premise. The police were experiencing several disorders by persons who had recently left G's premise. Mr Smith accepted what was being said but felt he does try and reduce trouble outside his premise. Mr Smith explained an incident whereby he saw a male on the floor who was intoxicated. He was not going to allow him into his premise and instead drove him home.

Inspector Hibbert proposed that Mr Smith trialled the condition of entry to his premise to stop allowing customers in after 0100hrs for a period of a month starting on 1st December. This would then show the review panel that is trying to work alongside the police in reducing crime and disorder as pr his licence. Mr Smith felt 0100hrs was too early and his business would not be able to survive.

Mr Smith agreed to initially shut his doors at 0130hrs for 1-2 weeks and then promote the new times and then reduce again to 0100hrs for the rest of the month.

Inspector Hibbert explained after the trail period we would have another meeting to discuss how it went.

Dear all

Following a meeting between myself, Sgt Nicki Entwistle and Mr George SMITH; licensee of GEE's nightclub; in relation to the problems caused by the opening hours policy the club runs we have agreed the following:

As from the 1st December the nightclub will close its doors to new entrants at 0130 hrs on a Friday, and 0200 hrs on a Saturday. At closing time any that are in the queue can enter but a member of the door staff will go to the end and stop new people joining it. Mr Smith has done this voluntarily and if he decides to change it back again he can do, that is up to him, HOWEVER if the doors do remain open, or the queue is allowed to keep forming then I want it recorded and fed back to PS Entwistle via Gen 40/ e-mail depending on the circumstances. This policy will be in place for the whole of December with a review in January 2012. The eventual aim will be for GEE's to close its doors to new entrants at 0100 hrs.

In an effort to support the club and crack down on disorder, officers on the town centre patrol are to make best use of Sect 27 notices early in the evening to identified individuals to get rid of potential trouble before it starts.

I want officers to be present in the area of the nightclub doors at 0130/0200 hrs to ensure compliance and any breaches to be challenged with the door staff/owner as to the reasons why entry is being allowed after the agreed time, and then fed back to PS Entwistle.

Officers are to wear bodycam when working, and checks made inside and outside the premises to monitor those who appear to be very drunk, yet still gain entry/ still get served. If inside please ensure you make the door staff aware of your concerns over an individual, and that in your professional opinion that the person is too drunk and should not be served further. If bodycam is not working then officers to take descriptions of those who are very drunk to match to suspects in any disorder in order to link them to the premises.

Officers are to carry the storenet radios while on patrol to ensure quick response to incidents at GEE's to support the door staff there.

Any incidents of disorder either at the premises or immediately outside, are to be recorded and details passed to PS Entwistle.

We want to help Mr Smith run his business in a way which will reduce disorder associated with the premises, and make it a safer environment for those attending, as well as lowering incidents of assault linked to drinking.

Many of the above actions will form part of OP JITTERBUG anyway, and will be part of the expected level of Policing.

Mr Walton confirmed that Yates wine bar had opening hours til 0300 hrs, so I agreed that last entry time would be at 0200 hrs both nights to NEW entrants, and I clarified that did not apply to those seeking reentry with the appropriate stamp. Mr Smith stated they used a UV pen to mark a person's hand on entry, and this will need to be carefully monitored to ensure only genuine re-entrants are let in.

I again clarified that if a queue of people were present at 0200 hrs then a member of the door staff would go to the end of the queue to stop new people joining it.

I explained the new stance to be taken re the patrolling of the night time economy; OP Jitterbug: and again re-affirmed our commitment to stop potential drunk troublemakers from getting to his premises.

Mr Walton explained that Mr Smith would have liked an 0215 hrs cut off time, and was willing to use his security staff to 'marshall' the taxi rank and the area around the kebab van. I listened to the offer and thanked him for it but stuck at the 0200 hrs cut off time.

At the end of the meeting the agreement was for the doors to close at 0200 hrs to new entrants, starting form this weekend until the end of December ,that Mr Walton would provide a dispersal plan to Mr Smith. that we would look to provide support in identifying and dealing with potential troublemakers by way of Sect 27 notices if appropriate. It was agreed that it was a voluntary agreement between the local police and Mr Smith and that he could revert back to his current opening policy if he felt business was suffering too much. However I also stated that if he did stop the trial then I would go to the licensing officers to have his licence reviewed.

We agreed to a mid trial review on the 21st December at 1100 hrs, where all parties involvement would be reviewed and discussed.



Dear Chief Constable

I would like to express my concerns regarding a meeting that I had with one of your officers, inspector David Hibbert, on 16th November 2011 held at Bicester Police station.

Inspector Hibbert invited me to meet with him to discuss the time that I should stop letting my customers in at G'S Bar and Nightclub on Friday and Saturday nights, as he felt that incidents happening in the town was related to people leaving my premises. Inspector Hibbert felt that when anyone was arrested in the Town Centre it was because my premises was the last place that they had visited.

Inspector Hibbert wanted me to close my doors at 01.00 am and this was something that I felt was detrimental to my business, as it is well documented that the licensing trade is going through difficult times in this present climate and my experience of 21 years has shown me that the bulk of my customers come to me between 01.45 am and 02.15 am due to the fact that I am competing against the multi-nationals such as Weatherspoon and Yeates. Over the years I have tried to get customers to come to me earlier but this has not worked and if I were to do as the Inspector is forcing me to do I will be out of business before the New Year.

During the meeting I felt bullied and the Inspector was trying to intimidate me by saying if I did not agree he would seek a review of my licence and impose the 01.00 am door closure time. I asked for reasons why I was being made to do this and was told that the Inspector felt that people who were arrested for a disturbance after 03.00 am had said that my premises were the last place they had been. In the last six months I have recorded in my Incident book 5 minor incidents so I am at a loss as to why the Inspector wants to put me out of business.

Over these long years I have built up a good relationship with the police and pride myself in helping the police at every given opportunity and I give my full support whenever I have been asked by the police.

My argument to the Inspector is why would shutting my doors at 01.00 am make a difference when I close at 3.00 am.

The Inspector has reluctantly agreed that I can close my doors at 01.30 am on a Friday and 2.00 am on a Saturday on a temporary basis because he wants to review it on 21st December 2011. I have gone along with this but I am not happy as it will have quite a significant impact on my business. Also from an unpractical viewpoint the Inspector is trying to impose a no entry or a re-entry to the premises, which will pose a problem, because it will mean that if a customer has a problem with their credit card and has to go to the cash

machine, they will not be allowed back in under the re-entry rule. In my opinion not being allowed back in would in itself create a problem.

Under the entry rule if I only have 30 people in the building by 01.30 am on a Friday I will not be allowed to let anyone else in even if there are people waiting outside, which would not be financially viable for me to stay open until 03.00 am. The whole basis of my business is that I am licensed to be open until 03.00 am, the same as Yeates.

I have sought legal advice as I believe this is grossly unfair. As a British Afro-Caribbean businessman in Bicester I am not saying that I am being singled out but I would like my case to be fairly dealt with because I feel there are no grounds for these conditions as I do not run a disorderly house and I make it my business to be a law abiding businessman and citizen.

I am in receipt of a letter dated 29 November. This has been passed to me by the Chief Constable's office to look into as the LPA Commander for Cherwell.

I am aware of the on-going discussions between yourself, Inspector Dave Hibbert and the Licensing Department. It is my understanding that the conditions that you have agreed to enter into are a consensual agreement that has been entered into after consultation with you all. These conditions were designed to reduce incidents of crime and disorder.

Should you wish to revert to your existing licensed hours that is a matter for yourself. I have deep concerns as to the volume and nature of incidents that have occurred in or around your premises during the recent months e.g.

16/7/11 problems with door staff struggling to contain a fight that spilled out onto the street, door staff were assaulted.

17/9/11 19 year old intoxicated female found naked in the premises toilets

15/10/11 large disorder of around 20 people started in alleyway of your premises, this then spread to Market Hill and the disorder increased to approximately 40-50 people who had all been in your premises.

30/10/11 dispute took place within your premises, suspect was removed and found to be only 16 this then led to an ABH as he punched a female in the face in the smoking area.

2/12/11 a very intoxicated female was let in by door staff after police said not to let her in

3/12/11 male was found in toilets extremely drunk

10/12/11 under age female found in premises

Contd.....

It is my view that maintaining the conditions that you have agreed to enter into will reduce the repetition of incidents such as those listed above.

Whilst I recognise the current difficult trading conditions that are affecting many local businesses, I am sure you understand our priority has to be the maintenance of law and order and ensuring the reduction of crime within our communities.

REF Meeting held 21st December 2011 at Bicester Police Station

We met to discuss the impact that the voluntary agreement has had on the premise.

- 1st weekend that the premise allowed no entry after 2am it was quiet throughout town. The 2nd weekend the hours were relaxed slightly. The 3rd weekend the agreement was stopped completely.
- Letter to the Chief was spoken about and it was stated that G's was not being 'picked on' and that there were incidents at the premise that warranted the action that is being taken. These incidents were discussed.
- The Inspector stated that he felt that the agreement had not been given enough time in order to see that it worked.
- George stated that if he had run this agreement for the entire of December then there would be no business to discuss.
- George then gave figures for the weekends.
- 2nd Dec 51 inside 78 turned away
- 3rd Dec 116 Inside 89 turned away
- 9th Dec 56 inside 71 turned away
- 10th Dec 56 Inside 89 turned away
- 16th Dec 102 inside 28 turned away door closed at 2.15
- 17th Dec 179 inside 22 turned away door closed 2.15
- George stated that he had handed out flyers letting customers know that they can't get in after 2am and he had given most persons turned away flyers but the numbers were not improving.
- When looking at the incidents it was brought up that door staff were not checking ID properly as there were 2 incidents where 17 year olds were seen in the premise.
- It was discussed that door staff were not helping with disorder in the town by telling those who were not allowed in that it was the Police's fault. This then caused confrontation with Police.
- George brought up an incident that occurred 3-4 years ago involving an officer and cocaine that he feels was not dealt with properly by the Police and stated that it was not included in my spread sheet. The Inspector has requested that full details be given to him about this incident. I talked George through the Incident list and explained how I compiled it.
- The Inspector stated that reducing crime and disorder in the Cherwell area is coming from the LPA commander and is throughout the whole of Cherwell not just Bicester.
- George stated that over the yeps because of relaxed anything and feels that it is the lack of Police at closing time that is the cause of the incidents. It was

stated that in Dec there has been an increase in officers in the town due to Op Jingle and that the incidents had increase not decreased at the premise.

It was stated that George had a storenet radio at the premise and that when persons were ejected it would be beneficial to call it in via the radio so CCTV could monitor if these people were waiting to cause disorder in town. It also means that persons can be removed by officers before disorder can occur. George stated that he would make sure this was being done and add it to the door staff policy.

George stated that by stopping entry at 2.15 it was more financially viable. He is going to provide CCTV from the 10th and the 17th Dec in order to see the

difference in stopping entry at 2am and 2.15.

We are due to meet again on the 18th January 2012 at 11am in Bicester Police Station.

- CCTV was to be provided from the 9th and 16th December. What was provided was from the 15th January and not the times when the door policy was in place. George stated that he had not had time over the Christmas period to sort this out.
- CCTV to be provided for the 23rd-24th, 30th-31st Dec and the 6th-7th, 13th-14th Jan. this is to be provided by 15.00 on the 23rd Jan.
- There had been one incident over the Christmas period but the Insp requested that door staff book was provided to see if there are incidents that do not correspond with the polices.
- The store net radio for G's has been reported as broken it is due to be fixed by the company but Police were not informed of this even though it was agreed that this should be more readily used at the last meeting. George stated that he thought the radio was not a Police matter so did not think to inform us. A spare radio has been given to George and it has been reiterated that all ejection are to be called in via the store net radio in order for Police to deal. George did state that he was unsure how long the radio has been broken but that it was broken before Christmas.
- Door staff policy from previous meeting to be submitted to the Police by 15.00 on the 23rd Jan.
- It was stated to George that it is not the amount of incidents at the premise that concerns us but how these incidents are dealt with.

The Inspector stated that his concerns were still

- That the premise was not using the radio
- That a door staff policy had not been put into place or submitted to police
- That he still thought that a no entry policy from 2am would improve crime and disorder.

This letter has been issued as a final warning to the premise and any further incidents of this nature whateal 68 the premises facing a review of its licence.

With regard to the weekend I understand you wanted some feedback for DMM; I have the following from the Bicester end.

Over Thurs / Fri / Sat we did Jitterbug patrol and we also dealt with some issues at G's and the Officers issued 13 S27 notices, the bulk on Saturday night. Having emphasised the need for early intervention it was not always necessary to issue a PND to accompany them, the S27 notice serving its purpose well. 3 PNDs issued and several arrests for Public Order / D&D / Assault. A special constable was assaulted on Saturday night at the Taxi rank but not seriously hurt. The rain definitely played its part in keeping things manageable.

Page 73

5 Gen40as were submitted by my team (two by me)- all for "G's". I Policed that particular premise extremely positively this weekend. From 0130hrs on I made sure I was at its door. I've had to challenge the door staff for allowing obviously intoxicated people to enter, for failing to monitor the store net radio- and thereby allowing people previously turned away from Yates to enter. Also on two occasions for not displaying their SIA armbands. There are numerous other matters recorded on the Gen40as. It was apparent that George the licensee did not welcome the attention and was asking Officers who I was.

By tonight he'd clearly had enough and decided to confront me. He's feeling financial pressures and repeated this several times. He states that he's being victimised by TVP, that over the last 6 months he's felt this, and that he is writing to the Chief. I made it clear to him that the ineffectiveness of his staff, his relaxed attitude to licensing law and the regular disorder caused by his clientele was the reason for the attention. I was able to list all the incidents directly related to his premise that weekend and combined with my observations of his staffs weak performance he had nothing argue about. He clearly hoped to intimidate me and when he realised he couldn't he calmed down. He says he will pay more attention to the door policy and instruct his staff accordingly. I warned him that I was submitting several licensing reports and his attitude was one of indifference. I don't think he likes me

In summary then, a decent amount of S27s and disposals (When you consider the rain), the only problems being caused by G's. My shift ensured they covered the taskings when possible, both our curfew checks were breached.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Sale of alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- 8. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

Door Supervision

- 9. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
 - a) unauthorised access or occupation (eg through door supervision), or
 - b) outbreaks of disorder, or
 - c) damage

Provision of Regulated Entertainment and Provision of Entertainment Facilities as detailed above

10. The licence-holder shall comply with the requirements of the Cherwell District Council (Public Entertainment) Regulations 1997 **Category A** in so far as these are applicable consistently with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and any statutory regulations made under that Act.

Maximum Numbers of Persons Present

11. The maximum number of persons present on the premises on any one occasion shall be limited to the following:-

Ground Floor - 108 persons First Floor - 120 persons

Number of Door Staff Required

- 12. (i) The required number of doorstaff to be present during each Public Entertainment Event.
 - (ii) Door staff shall be employed to supervise the premises until 30 minutes after the premises have closed or until they have been completely vacated by all patrons.

CCTV

13. When the premises are in operation they shall be monitored by a CCTV system. The images shall be recorded onto a tape or digital storage system which shall be capable of retaining and replaying recorded information for a minimum of one month from the recording date. For the avoidance of doubt, if the Licensing Authority so require in connection with any investigation they are undertaking in respect of the premises any tape or digital storage media shall be given up to them immediately on request.

Nuisance

- 14. (a) The Licensee shall ensure that all persons resorting to the licensed premises for the first time are provided with a written code of the behaviour, which is expected of persons using the premises. Such information will include reference to the likelihood of persons being banned from the licensed premises if they do not conduct themselves in an appropriate manner and of the fact that any ban will be vigorously enforced by the staff controlling admission to the premises.
 - (b) The Licensee shall ensure that adequate action is taken to identify persons who cause disturbance within the premises, or those who may cause a nuisance or annoyance to residents or passers-by upon arriving at or leaving the premises. Such persons must be formally warned about their conduct and advised in writing if and when they are banned temporarily, or permanently, from attending the licensed premises and are asked not to do so. The staff who supervise the admission to the premises shall be kept advised by management of the identities of persons whose access is temporarily or permanently restricted in order that such staff may exercise the controls referred to in standard condition 2.1.
 - (c) Noise from amplified music, or voices, shall not be such as to cause a disturbance to occupants within residential properties (with the windows open in the normal manner for ventilation) within the vicinity of the licensed premises.
 - (d) The Licensing Authority may stipulate that live or recorded music be played at levels which it has previously notified to the Licensee either for one particular occasion or a series of occasions.
 - (e) All doors and windows shall remain closed during entertainment events

Management Policy and Protocols

- 15. (a) Queue Management
 - (i) The Licensee shall operate a queue management policy which is acceptable to the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Authority may require, subject to the views of the Police and/or Highway Authority, barriers to be provided as part of any queue management policy, or any other devices which may facilitate the necessary controls agreed with the Licensing Authority.
 - (ii) Without prejudice to any other matters referred to in the policy, there should be provision for the identification of potential under-age persons by the production of suitably reliable forms of identification.
 - (iii) The policy shall be produced for approval to the Licensing Authority.
 - (b) Participation in Pubwatch
 - (i) The licensee, or a person employed in a management capacity at the premises shall attend the local meetings of "Bicester Pubwatch" on each occasion they are convened in order to participate in the arrangements which are decided in relation to persons who shall not be allowed into premises with on-licences. The decisions relating to these who are banned from entering premises under the pub-watch arrangements shall be vigorously enforced by the licensee.
 - (ii) In the event the licensee is unable to participate in any meeting of pub-watch a management level deputy shall attend in their stead.
 - (iii) The participation in the pub-watch scheme may require the provision by the licensee of a radio or radios to be used at the premises in connection with the passage of information to similar establishments in connection with the exchange of information under the pub-watch scheme. Where operated, operational capability to use the radios shall be demonstrated to the Licensing Authority.
 - (c) Protocol for Intervention Management

The Licensing Authority shall be provided with a written protocol by the licensee which sets out how the venue will be suitably controlled so as to ensure that all appropriate staff are aware of the need to prevent the excessive consumption of alcohol, and that a system is in place which can provide for the Police to be called to intervene if necessary in any developing problems within the premises which are likely to have effect on public order.

No Drinks Promotions without Approval

- 14. (i) No promotions involving alcoholic drinks being sold at lower prices than the licensee would normally charge shall take place in connection with any public entertainment event held on any day without the prior agreement of the licensing authority who shall first consult the Police. Any application for an event involving such a drinks promotion shall be made at least 14 days prior to the event.
 - (ii) Where drinks promotions have been agreed under (i) they shall not be varied without prior reference to the Licensing Authority.







and on Sundays to 1.00 am except when the Sunday is followed by a bank holiday when the extensions shall be to 4.00 am;

(iii) last admission to be one hour before licensable activities ceases; and

(iv) provision of dancing entertainment.

Mr Butterfield the solicitor for the applicant indicated that following discussions with the Police and the Head of Environmental Services conditions have now been agreed they were acceptable to both the applicant and the responsible authorities.

Mr Butterfield addressed the Sub-Committee on the objections made by Mr Bone.

Police confirmed that they had now agreed to conditions which:-

(i) extended licensable activities on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and on Sundays which were followed by a bank holiday Monday to 3.00 am and not 4.00 am as originally requested. On eight occasions a year an extension of licensable activities would be agreed until 4.00 am provided in each case 28 days notice was given to the Police;

(ii) restricted admission after 1.00 am;

(iii) required persons aged 18 and above to be admitted to the premises in accordance with CD28 of the pool of conditions

The Head of Environmental Services confirmed that he had agreed to erotic dances being undertaken on one night per week subject to the following condition:-

"No regulated entertainment involving erotic dancing shall take place until a detailed operating schedule describing how the activities shall comply with relevant conditions with the Council's pool of conditions has been submitted in writing for approval by the Licensing Authority. The activity shall be carried out in accordance with the approved operating schedule."

The Head of Environmental Services stated that in the event of the applicant not agreeing to the conditions set out by the Licensing Authority this would be referred to the Sub-Committee for determination.

Mr Bone, speaking as an interested party, indicated the problems that he suffered as a local resident and his concerns regarding the likely exacerbation of that situation by an extension in operating hours.

The Sub-Committee then retired to consider the application. Upon the return of the Sub-Committee it was


RESOLVED that the variation to the premises licence now requested be agreed, subject to additional conditions indicated to the Sub-Committee by the Police and the Head of Environmental Services.

Reason: the Sub-Committee is not satisfied from the evidence it has heard, that the hours sought should not be granted.

Licensing Act 2003 – Possible Breach of Premises Licence Conditions.

I write further to my visit with Alex Bloomfield from Thames Valley Police Licensing on Friday 25 January 2008. As you are aware it has been reported to this office that there have been a number of possible breaches of the conditions attached to the Premises Licence in respect of G's Wine Bar, Deans Court, Bicester.

During the visit Mr Bloomfield and I outlined the incidents logged for the premises from August 2007 to present. We compared these to your incident log at the premises.

There were a number of incidents that highlight areas of serious concern for Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority. The main issues are:-

- Sale of alcohol to persons underage;
- Sale of alcohol to persons already intoxicated;
- Completion of the Incident Log;
- Behaviour of the Door Supervisors; and
- General Management of the Premises during the evening

We discussed possible solutions to the issues raised and suggested that you develop an action plan as a way forward. This action plan can then be presented to Thames Valley Police.

We outlined the Thames Valley Police three step principle, explaining that step one would be contact from an officer concerning any issues arising from incidents. Step two would be a more formal visit from the Thames Valley Police Licensing Officer to develop an action plan to promote the licensing objectives and step three would be to request a review of the premises licence at a hearing in front of the Licensing Committee. It was explained that a serious incident could result in a premises going straight to step three.

In this case one of the incidents is of a very serious nature and could possibly result in a review being requested. It is imperative that an action plan is developed and implemented as soon as possible. Mr Bloomfield and I requested that the plan should be sent to us by 10:00am on Friday 1 February 2008.



The action plan should address each of the issues identified. At the meeting Mr Bloomfield and I suggested a number of ways to prevent similar issues arising in the future:-

Sale of alcohol to persons underage

Implement a "think 21" Campaign. Advice can be found on the British Beer and Pub Association website, including downloadable posters and general information. http://www.beerandpub.com/industryArticle.aspx?articleId=85
This should be used at all times — No ID no alcohol. People will soon get used to having to provide ID at the premises.

Training of staff to ensure that all are aware of their responsibilities under the Act. This should

Sale of alcohol to persons already intoxicated

Training of staff to ensure that all are aware of their responsibilities under the Act. This should be recorded in a training log.

A refusals log for use behind each of the bars. Staff should record each time someone is refused supply of alcohol due to being intoxicated.

Completion of the Incident Log

be recorded in a training log.

Door Supervisors should complete the log using their real names and their SIA (Security Industry Authority) numbers.

Door Supervisors and bar staff must complete the incident log for each incident whether or not Door Supervisors were on duty and whether or not police were called. We would expect this incident log to mirror the police intelligence received. This is not currently the case.

Behaviour of the Door Supervisors

The incidents relating to the behaviour of the Door Supervisors are among the most serious at the premises. It was suggested that you review your staffing provisions to ensure that you have Door Supervisors that are able to manage situations in a calm and professional manner.

You must ensure that all Door Supervisors are SIA registered. Do not rely on the door company checking this. You should ask to see verification of SIA registration before a Door Supervisor takes up their post.

All Door Supervisors must wear their SIA Badge on display at all times. It must be visible to members of the public.

General Management of the Premises during the evening

A number of the incidents occur when you are not present at the premises. Whilst it is appreciated that you are not able to be at the premises at all times, it is your responsibility to ensure that the premises is operated in such a way as to promote public safety, protect children from harm and to prevent public nuisance and crime and disorder.

It is suggested that you review staffing to ensure that you are at the premises during peak times and that when you are away from the premises that is properly managed by a person

who is aware of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act. You could for example ensure that duty managers are also personal licence holders or at the very least they have been trained by you. This should be recorded in a training log.

A person commits an offence under Section 136 (1) (a) of the Act if they carry on or attempt to carry on licensable activities on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation and is liable upon summary conviction to imprisonment of up to 6 months or to a fine of up to £20,000 or to both.

A number of the concerns highlighted breach specific conditions of the Premises Licence, therefore, licensable activities will have been carried out otherwise than in accordance with the existing Premises Licence.

When drafting your action plan, please can I ask you to read through all of the conditions attached to the Premises Licence and to ensure that any person charged with the responsibility of operating the Premises is aware of the importance of compliance with these conditions.

On 8 occasions a year an extension on licensable activities would be agreed until 04:00 provided in each case 28 days notice was given to the Police.



The only time that Mr Smith would have to depart from these hours would be if:

- 1. they were changed further to an application by Mr Smith to vary the hours permitted by the Premises Licence;
- 2. they were changed by way of hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee further to an application for review from a responsible authority or an interested party; or
- 3. the Police Authority used the powers given to them by Part 8 of the Licensing Act 2003 which allows them to seek court orders to close licensed premises in a geographical area that is experiencing or likely to experience disorder; and to close down instantly individual licensed premises that are:
 - disorderly;
 - likely to become disorderly; or
 - are causing nuisance as a result of noise from the premises.

The police should, whenever possible, seek the voluntary co-operation of licensees, managers and others in resolving incidents of disorder, potential disorder and noise nuisance rather than move directly to a decision to seek a review or use a closure order.

It is my understanding that Inspector Hibbert met with Mr Smith and his legal representative in early December to discuss the concerns that the Police had in relation to the operation of the premises. I believe that during this meeting Mr Smith agreed to operate a "last entry" time of 02:00, preventing new customers from accessing the premises after this time. Customers who had already entered the building prior to 02:00 would be able to obtain a re-entry stamp should they wish to leave the premises to smoke for example. The premises would in all other respects still operate as per the licence conditions detailed above.

A mid-trial review was held on 21 December. Mr Smith had operated the 02:00 last entry time for the first 2 weekends of December but had relaxed this to 02:15 on the 3 weekend. A further review is scheduled for 18 January 2012.

At any time Mr Smith is free to revert back to his existing conditions and permissions of his licence, but should there be continuing instances of concern to the Police, they may consider seeking a review of the Premises Licence.

Good afternoon Laura,

This morning/afternoon I carried out a Fire Safety Audit under the Fire Safety Order at the above premises and met with Mr George Smith.

This audit was carried out as a result of concerns raised by TVP to OFRS.

I haven't had time yet to complete the paperwork and work out the final result/compliance level but I can confirm that the following deficiencies were found during the audit;

- No written Fire Risk Assessment had been completed/carried out, it is a requirement under the FSO for a written FRA to be carried out and available at the premises because it is a licensed premises. Mr Smith did advise me that he has carried out a FRA albeit theoretically, on questioning as to the content of his theoretical FRA it was clear that he had no real comprehension as to the required details and as such I deemed his FRA as not being suitable nor sufficient.
- There was no evidence of any fire alarm or emergency lighting testing having been carried out, verbally Mr Smith suggested that he checks/tests the fire alarm every 2 months or so and the same for the emergency lighting system, the BS for fire alarms suggests that the system should be tested weekly by the occupier and emergency lighting monthly by the occupier. During my audit I requested that the emergency lighting system be energised and I found a number of external emergency lighting units not working.
- There was no evidence that staff training had been carried out although again Mr Smith advised me that staff have received fire safety training.
- Fire exit signage leading from the exit route from the first floor via the internal staircase needs to be improved.
- There is no company policy or effective emergency plan recorded, given the use
 of the premises and the customer group I would expect a written emergency plan
 to be produced with fire safety responsibilities clearly defined.
- There is no evidence to suggest that the fire alarm and emergency lighting systems are subjected to a suitable system of maintenance.
- A number of fire doors were wedged open during my audit reducing the level of compartmentation within the premises should a fire occur.
- Two final fire exits was obstructed due to parked vans (builders working on new flat conversion above shops) and a large wheelie bin.

- The push bar to a final fire exit on the ground floor was broken and missing and Mr Smith is relying on the other door leaf opening to operate the broken side, (it is working so not a major issue but I would expect this to be repaired)
- The last fire evacuation drill was carried out in November 2011, this was during trading hours when a customer broke one of the break glass call points, again there is no record of evacuation training having been carried out.

Incidentally Mr Smith did inform me that dancers were in this evening and the number of door staff that he employs from an outside agency numbers 3, I note in the license conditions CD73 suggests that he should have 5 door staff on duty whilst dancing takes place, I will leave you to follow this one up.

I have a feeling that I will be issuing a Notification of Fire Safety Deficiencies to this premises and I will be carrying out a follow up visit towards the end of this month.

Before I left the premises I made Mr Smith aware of the deficiencies and whilst I was there he made 2 telephone calls to organise the repair of the emergency lights and to arrange a suitable competent person to carry out and complete a suitable and sufficient Fire Risk Assessment for the premises.

I will keep you informed on final audit outcome. I also have your licensing review details on my desk, we would usually deal with any issues through an audit using the FSO and appropriate follow up action as necessary.

It has been reported to this office that there has been a possible breach of the conditions attached to the Premises Licence in respect of the above named premises.

The information given stated that:

 On 2 August 2012, only two members of Door Staff were working whilst the premises were open to the public and regulated entertainment in the form of erotic dancing was taking place

As the holder of the Premises Licence, I felt that I should write to remind you of your responsibilities and the offences under the Act. We refer you specifically to the following conditions attached to your Premises Licence:

CD73 Whilst dancing takes place not less than 4 registered Door Supervisors shall be on duty on the premises.

A person commits an offence under Section 136 (1) (a) of the Act if they carry on or attempt to carry on licensable activities on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation and is liable upon summary conviction to imprisonment of up to 6 months or to a fine of up to £20,000 or to both.

If the information given to the Licensing Authority is correct, licensable activities will have been carried out otherwise than in accordance with the existing Premises Licence.

In addition it is also your responsibility to ensure that the four Licensing Objectives are promoted, these are;

- the prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- Public Safety;
- the Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
- the protection of Children from Harm.

The reported concerns detailed above would have an impact on your ability to promote these objectives, specifically the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

Please can I ask you to read through all of the conditions attached to the Premises Licence and to ensure that any person charged with the responsibility of operating the Premises is aware of the importance of compliance with these conditions. Further information relating to breaches will be fully investigated and may result in formal action being taken.
