Purpose of report

To consider an application for a Licensing Act 2003 Premises Licence for Tropic Bar, Pioneer Square, Bicester.

1.0 Recommendations

1.1 There is no recommendation, but in considering the representations received and what is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, the steps the Sub-Committee can take are outlined in paragraph 6.2.

2.0 Introduction

2.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence submitted for Tropic Bar, Pioneer Square, Bicester submitted by Tropic Bar Ltd.

3.0 Report Details

- 3.1 Tropic Bar will be situated in Unit A/8 in Pioneer Square, Bicester. It is situated on the roadside and is approximately 872 square feet. It is a building on one floor and the applicants intend to use it primarily as a tapas bar. It benefits from the correct planning use class, A3.
- 3.2 An application for a Licensing Act 2003 premises licence was submitted to Cherwell District Council on 17 March 2017. The original application was for sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, live music, recorded music and late night refreshment seven days a week between 7am and 1.30am with a closing time of 2am. The application with volunteered conditions and plan is attached as Appendix 1. Sarah Silva, co-director of Tropic Bar Ltd has since had a Personal Licence granted by Cherwell District Council and will be the Designated Premises Supervisor.

3.3 On the 23 March 2017 Laura Warner from Thames Valley Police and Neil Whitton from Environmental Protection, Cherwell District Council met with the business owners, Dario Abreau and Sarah Florr, to discuss the application. This resulted in a number of changes being agreed. Live Music was removed from the application and the hours authorising the sale of alcohol, recorded music and late night refreshment were amended as follows; sale of alcohol – Sunday-Thursday 7am to 11pm, Friday and Saturday 7am to 11.30pm, recorded music – Sunday to Thursday 7am to 11pm, Friday and Saturday 7am to 11.45pm, late night refreshment – Friday and Saturday 11pm to Midnight. Agreement attached at Appendix 2.

4.0 Conclusion and Reasons for Recommendations

4.1 There is no recommendation.

5.0 Consultation

- 5.1 When an application for a premises licence is submitted the applicant must display a blue notice at or near the relevant premises and advertise the application in a local publication no later than 10 days after submitting the application. The consultation period runs for 28 days from the day after the application is received. This gives interested parties and responsible authorities the opportunity to make representations in relation to the application.
- 5.2 The responses from responsible authorities were as follows:
 - Police liaised directly with the applicant
 - Fire Service No response
 - Child Protection No response
 - Trading Standards No objection
 - Health & Safety Executive No response
 - Environmental Protection liaised directly with the applicant
 - Health Protection No response
 - Planning No response
 - Parish Council Representation received (Councillor Mould)
- 5.3 There have also been twelve representations received from local residents all objecting to the application, these include a petition signed by 41 residents of Hanover Gardens
- 5.4 The applicant and all interested parties submitting representations have been invited to attend this hearing.

6.0 Alternative Options and Reasons for Rejection

- 6.1 At the end of the consultation period the licensing authority must hold a hearing if relevant representations are received. It must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm
- 6.2 The steps the Sub-Committee can take are to:
 - issue the licence as applied for;
 - issue the licence with amended hours or licensable activities
 - reject the application if it is considered necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives

7.0 Implications



CD18. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open to the public.

CD28. All members of staff at the premises shall seek "credible photographic proof of age evidence" from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years and who is seeking access to the premises or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence, or Proof of Age card carrying a "PASS" logo.

CD29. Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at any points of sale, advising customers that they may be asked to produce evidence of their age.

CD31. Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed outside every public entrance stating the actual operating hours of the premises.

CD48. All Door Supervisors shall have clear instruction and understanding of their responsibilities.

Public Safety

PS2. All escape routes and exits including external exits shall be maintained unobstructed, in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified in accordance with the approved arrangements.

PS3. All exit doors shall be available and easily openable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means. Only approved fastenings shall be used.

Note: Doors that are not in regular use should be opened in order to ensure they function satisfactorily before the admission of the public.

PS13. Curtains, hangings and temporary decorations shall be arranged so as not to obstruct exits, fire safety signs or fire-fighting equipment.

PS17. The premises shall be provided with adequate facilities to monitor and control the number of people present.

PS19. The fire service shall be called at once to any outbreak or suspected outbreak of fire, however slight, and the details recorded in the Fire log-book.

PS22. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.

PS23. At least one suitably trained first-aider shall be on duty when the public are present. If more than one suitably trained first-aider is present, each person's responsibilities shall be clearly identified.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

PN1. The Designated Premises Supervisor/Duty Manager shall ensure that no nuisance is caused by noise emanating from the premises or by vibration transmitted through the structure of the premises.

PN2. The premises shall be arranged to minimise the risk of noise nuisance to nearby properties.

PN9. The [*doors / windows*] at [*specify*] shall be fitted with [*double /secondary*] glazing in order to improve the sound attenuation of the premises.

PN18. Entertainment is to be held internally only and no music or speakers shall be provided to external areas of the premises.

PN28. All queuing outside the premises shall be managed in such a way that prevents noisy or rowdy behaviour and therefore minimises disturbance or nuisance to neighbours.

PN31. The premises shall be effectively ventilated.


PN32. All vents and extraction systems shall be constructed and operated so as to prevent noxious smells from causing a nuisance to nearby properties.

PN34. Any air filters shall be periodically cleaned or replaced so as to maintain a satisfactory air supply.



I have discovered that an application has been made by a company called Tropic Bar for a licence to sell alcohol and to provide recorded/live music and late night refreshments at one of the shop units behind the bus stops in Manorsfield Road. I understand that the company propose to operate until 11 pm on Sunday to Thursday and until midnight on Friday and Saturday.

The site is only about 100 yards from my house, across the Hunt Close green. I am extremely concerned at the prospect of loud music being played every evening, to the detriment of Hunt Close residents' quiet enjoyment of their property. I personally am elderly and not in the best of health, and rely on a full night's sleep, and I therefore view the present proposals with the utmost trepidation.

If the District Council are able to apply restrictions on any licence granted, so as to ensure that sound from the entertainment is contained within the building, I urge them to do so; otherwise I should be grateful if you would take this letter as an objection in principle to the grant of a licence.

I write as a resident of Hunt Close Bicester living less than 100 metres from the premises to which the above application applies.

I together with my neighbours are concerned with the following issues in relation to this application.

The application refers to live and recorded music. The premises are relatively small and have a single entry door without a lobby which means that very time the door is opened there is potential for the noise to become a nuisance. I believe that the only way to minimise this is to install noise monitoring equipment that would shut off the music if the agreed decibel level were breached and to look at some form of lobby.

Secondly I am concerned that smokers will congregate around the entrance which is directly behind the bus stop thus persons queuing for the buses will be subject to secondary smoking. Many bus passengers are travelling with young children and should not be subject to this.

Thirdly there needs to be controls in place that make sure no drinks are taken off the premises. If this is not enforced there is potential for significant nuisance through noise to the neighbours.

I believe that the premises will require door staff to enforce any conditions the licensing body may see fit to impose. Should this application go to the licensing committee I would wish to make representation on behalf of the local residents.

I am opposed to this licence application on the grounds of risk to public safety and public nuisance.

Judging by their own publicity, Tropic Bar is to be a Mediterranean-style bar that sells strong alcoholic cocktails and plays music late into the night: it is to be a drinking establishment, not a restaurant/cafe, requiring Class A4 planning permission as I understand it. Such a venue might be suited to within the town centre, however this bar is to be located amongst the bus stops between the Pop-in Centre and the ShopMobility Centre, and directly opposite a quiet residential area housing many elderly people as well as young families. The location is entirely inappropriate for a bar.

The adjacent residential area is currently shielded from the late-night noise of the town centre by the Sainsbury and cinema buildings, and there is no other bar/pub with frontage onto Manorsfield Road. It would be naive to assume that the venue's doors and windows would always be securely closed to contain the noise within, or that there would be no noise created outside by patrons leaving the premises in numbers at closing time, perhaps using the public spaces opposite the bar as an extension of the premises after hours. Any noise created by music or high-spirited patrons would be immediately noticeable above the low level of background noise in the surrounding area, and the increased noise levels until beyond midnight would cause repeated and unavoidable nuisance to local residents, old and young.

It might also be expected that there will be obstruction and nuisance to pedestrians at the bus stops owing to high-spirited patrons queuing or spilling out onto the footpath, as the premises opens directly onto the footpath also used as the bus station where people young and old queue for buses.

Further, I question whether the police will have sufficient additional resource, either now or in the future, to enforce any licence conditions at this new venue on Manorsfield Road or to guarantee the protection of the public and property outside the venue (including any teenage children queuing at the bus stops after the cinema) from the inevitable occurrence of alcohol-fuelled antisocial behaviour; as far as I can tell, the police are already committed to Sheep Street at nights on weekends, where several pubs are in close proximity.

I am also not convinced by the licence application that the owners have sufficient relevant experience to ensure the safe and considerate operation of this bar, and indeed a lack of consideration for local residents has already been demonstrated while parking illegally on the double yellow lines in the entrance to Hunt Close to unload stock.

Further questions could be raised about the public cost of cleaning up the footpath outside the venue, and whether the design of the premises itself is suitable for use as a bar (it was originally designated as 'Kiosks' in the building's planning application).

Having examined the details of this application as shown on the District Council's Public Access web pages, we wish to make representations in respect of the application on potential public nuisance grounds.

Our property is about 50 metres from the application premises, immediately opposite across Manorsfield Road. We consider it likely that the operations for which the licence application is made will result in disturbance to us, in terms of both noise and movement and behaviour of patrons.

Our first concern is about the potential volume of the "Recorded & Live Music", which we believe is unlikely to be containable within the premises. Unit A8 is small, and there seems little scope for installing a double door system to prevent sound escaping as patrons enter and leave. Moreover, during warm weather there will inevitably be a temptation to prop the doors open to aid ventilation, leaving no obstruction to the escape of sound.

We see that the proposed licence conditions shown on the Public Access web pages in relation to this application include general requirements to minimise the risk of noise nuisance to nearby properties (conditions PN1 and PN2). We consider these to be wholly inadequate. If a licence were to be granted, more specific and enforceable restrictions should be imposed, including conditions such as those numbered PN3 to PN8 in the Council's Pool of Conditions, incorporating measurable limits to ensure that noise is effectively not discernible from our and other nearby properties; and those numbered PN13 and PN14, in order to ensure that sound does not escape when doors are opened.

The second concern relates to the movement of patrons to and from the premises. Because of its location immediately adjacent to the main town bus stops with limited pavement space, there is a clear risk of conflict with people waiting for, boarding and alighting from buses, particularly in the event of queuing for admission. We note that proposed licence condition PN28 requires queuing outside the premises to be managed so as to prevent noisy or rowdy behaviour. This does not address problems that might be caused by sheer numbers, and because of limitations of space the scope for queue management in practice seems very limited.

Thirdly we are concerned that patrons moving away from the premises when they close will result in disturbance to local residents - in Hunt Close and Hanover Gardens in particular. There are likely to be concentrations of such movements in the half-hour after midnight on Fridays and Saturdays, and the half-hour after 11 pm on other nights. The proposed licence conditions shown on the Public Access web pages do not address this issue, and the standard conditions in the Council's Pool of Conditions which attempt to do so (PN16 and PN29) are unlikely to be effective, bearing in mind the doubtless buoyant state of patrons after "a good night out".

As original residents of Hunt Close we have constantly seen the demise of what was a peaceful residential area by the unrestricted development of Bicester town centre and would wish to request the application for alcohol and live or recorded music plus late night refreshment be refused for the following reasons:-

- 1. The location next to a bus stop is totally inappropriate when alcohol is not accepted on public transport vehicles for obvious reasons.
- 2. The venue is opposite domestic dwellings for which due consideration is required to ensure noise levels are not causing a nuisance to occupiers at any time of day or night.
- 3. Currently domestic dwellings are affected by drunken revellers returning from Oxford at 3.0am in the morning a situation which is currently unacceptable.
- 4. Late at night we currently have arguments and even fights between unruly late night drinkers.
- 5. A bar such as this should be located in the centre of Bicester alongside other similar properties or where they have less impact on domestic dwellings and their occupants.
- 6. This location would also attract more traffic dropping off such as taxis which are not permitted in the bus depot in at the end of Hunt Close which will have double yellow lines.
- 7. There is the potential for drinkers to spill out onto the bus depot area which can on occasions be difficult to traverse by pedestrians.
- 8. Existing provision of toilet facilities within the unit is inadequate at present. If adequate facilities are not provided then drinkers will use public spaces as currently occurs late at night.
- 9. Delivery vehicles will obstruct the bus lanes.
- 10. The impact on Hanover Gardens with live music and late nights would be morally wrong.
- 11. Can some consideration be given towards those people who live in the shadow of Sainsburys and its array of daily problems it brings to local residents and this will be yet another one that is totally unacceptable.
- 12. Many people who live opposite this application premises are elderly and would appreciate some consideration a matter Cherwell District Council fail to provide, these local people pay exorbitant Council Tax to a Council who fails to look after their interests and wellbeing.
- 13. This type of application can ultimately lead to anti social behaviour and increased noise for those living in close proximity. Our interests need to be addressed.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I would like to register my objection (before 12th April 2017) against the proposed granting of a liquor/live music and late night refreshment licence at Unit A8 Pioneer Square.

This is a wholly inappropriate use of that unit. The unit faces out on to Manorsfield Road, which is a largely residential street with residences overlooking the street in particular in Hunt Close and Hanover Gardens. Any noise created by this premises would pass over the street and affect nearby neighbours. I live in Hunt Close and have been adversely affected by parking and anti-social problems as a result of the development of Pioneer Square over the last couple of years.

I regard the granting of this proposed licence as contributing to further alcohol related issues for our family and my neighbours in the vicinity. We live in some of the closest properties to Unit A8 and are concerned at experiencing increased parking problems in Hunt Close (which the Local Authority have recognised and are trying to address through strengthening parking restrictions by implementing double yellow lines).

To grant this proposed license would exacerbate current issues being experienced by local residents of noisy 'night time economy users' walking back to the estates through the busy walkway through Hunt Close into Queens Avenue. This would detrimentally affect the quality of life of nearby residents - compounded by the fact that a majority of whom are elderly and/or families who particularly value their peace and quiet especially at night. If you factor in that police patrols are increasingly rare, after facing budgetary constraints, this will only pose further problems - when alcohol related incidents arise, that will not be properly policed.

It must also be recognised that the town river runs opposite and Manorsfield Road is already busy, with buses and coaches passing close by, which all pose hazards to potentially drunk customers vacating the premises late at night.

Should you be unsure as to the disproportionate impact that this proposal may have on local residents, I would welcome any decision makers to experience a Friday/Saturday night in Hunt Close, when the other existing licensed premises in Bicester town centre close their doors to their patrons.

I trust this is the information you require to make a balanced and rational decision on this proposal.
