Further to the notice of application for a premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 that has been posted on the premises of 179 Warwick Road we would like to object to this application.

We have no objection to the premises being used for the retail sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises however we do strongly object to the opening hours. This is a residential area and the early and late opening times will impact on the local residents causing a noise nuisance.

Mr Roasties currently closes at 10.30pm Monday – Thursday and Friday and Saturday is 11am to 11pm and the C&R chip shop closes at 10am Mon to Saturday.

None of the current traders on this parade of shops opens after 6pm on a Sunday. Sunday evening therefore is the only quiet period within the week which allows the residences a rest bite from noise caused by cars pulling up, doors slamming and radios at high volume and loud voices and on some occasion's arguments caused by drink.

Even though Mr Roasties closes at 11pm there are still customers and staff hanging around outside the premises causing considerable noise. With the possibility of an off licence opening and closing at the same time will cause more people and noise nuisance late at night which is one of our main concerns therefore Sunday quietness is very important to us.

As our evenings are disturbed it is nice to have a little piece and quiet in the mornings however if this is opening at 6am we will find that cars will park under our bedroom window, banging car doors when getting in and out of the vehicles and the entering and exiting from the premises which in term disturbs our sleep.

The newsagents opens early morning however most customers park outside the newsagents or outside the chip shop further away from our bedroom window. Previously when 179 Warwick Road was an off licence the opening times were 10am to 10pm.

In our opinion consideration should be given to reducing the opening times to 10am to 10pm Monday to Saturday and Sunday 10am to 6pm.

We would ask that you take into consideration our feedback before granting any application.

Re: Mr Kanthappu Balamurali, 179 Warwick Road, Banbury, Oxon, OX16 1AS.

I wish to object to the alcohol licence application by Mr Kanthappu Balamurali, 179 Warwick Road, Banbury, Oxon, OX16 1AS. I have an interest in this application that is greater than the general public because I live less than 500 meters from the proposed premises.

I object to the application on the following grounds:

Objection 1:

Prevention of Public Nuisance. I am extremely concerned in relation to noise pollution that would be generated with such long licensing hours as proposed in the application. Warwick Road already has a suitable off-licence with adequate hours, which has provided a service to the local area and its residents for some many years now. I am concerned that the residents will suffer from noise nuisance from premises not to mention further issues arising such as littering of the Warwick Road which will be a further nuisance to the residents who will be left to clear rubbish from their place of residence.

Objection 2:

I am concerned with regards to public safety should a further premises be opened on the Warwick Road where there is already sufficient outlets for residents to purchase alcohol. Providing a further source would only go against the licensing objectives and would be detrimental to public safety with members of the community purchasing alcohol from the early hours of the morning until late into the night should the application be granted. I take the view that Council should do more to promote public safety to the surrounding community of Warwick Road, therefore allowing such an application would be in direct contradiction to the objectives of the licensing authority's aims.

Objection 3:

As a resident of Warwick Road, I am concerned about litter, bottles being left around which will make my neighbourhood look unpleasant, and will make it less pleasant to live here. Not to mention the increased chance of people urinating in the local areas if they are intoxicated and wishing to purchase further alcohol in that state.

Finally, I have resided on the Warwick Road for some 10 years now, and I have witnessed local children going to and from school. My concern is that with the new premises if the application were granted, would encourage young children to purchase alcohol. The licence holder at the shop on the Warwick Road has been in this area for 11 years and together with his staff, is well acquainted with the local children and has adequate training in recognising young children attempting to purchase alcohol. There have been no conditions attached to the notice of the application pursued for 179 Warwick Road therefore I am unable to comment as to what steps would be taken to limit sale of alcohol to minors, limit noise pollution, littering and any of the other issues I have raised above in my objections by the applicant.

I urge the Authority to refuse the application for the grounds mentioned above.

I intend to present my objections at any Hearing therefore would seek that the Council provide me with notification of any such hearing taking place.

I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence by Mr Kanthappu Balamurali, 179 Warwick Road, Banbury, Oxon, OX16 1AS. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behavior.

179 Warwick Road lies within the Council's Cumulative Impact Area, and enabling the premises to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 6.00am and 11.00pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises. I take the view that a further source so close to the vicinity of Cromwell Road will lead to an increase of alcohol crime, disorder and public nuisance. The hours are wholly disproportionate and as a senior member of the community I take the view that the application ought to be refused.

I fear Residents in this area would suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behavior at all hours of the day and night. It would be wholly unacceptable to expect the residents to suffer such nuisance.

I would also urge the Committee to consider the findings of the Health Impact Assessment, in which evidence of the negative effects of the

flexible licensing hours was put forward by local residents, the document presented to the Licensing Strategy Group by the North Laine Community Association, and the draft Statement of Licensing Policy, September 2010.

In view of the above, I would urge the Licensing Authority to refuse the application.
