Section 349 of The Gambling Act 2005 requires all licensing authorities to prepare and publish a statement of principles that they propose to apply in exercising their functions under the Act and in particular the following three licensing objectives: Keeping gambling crime free Making sure that gambling is fair and open Protecting children and vulnerable adults The Statement of Licensing Principles is required to be reviewed every three years. To help the process, the Act requires the Gambling Commission to issue statutory guidance to Licensing Authorities on the manner in which they are to exercise their functions under the Act and the principles to be applied by them in exercising those functions. Licensing Authorities are required to take account of all such guidance. The statutory guidance is designed to ensure the spread of best practice and consistency of approach in decision making amongst licensing authorities, whilst not preventing authorities from properly exercising the discretion they have to take account of appropriate and relevant local issues and factors.
