Will I be informed of the outcome at all please?

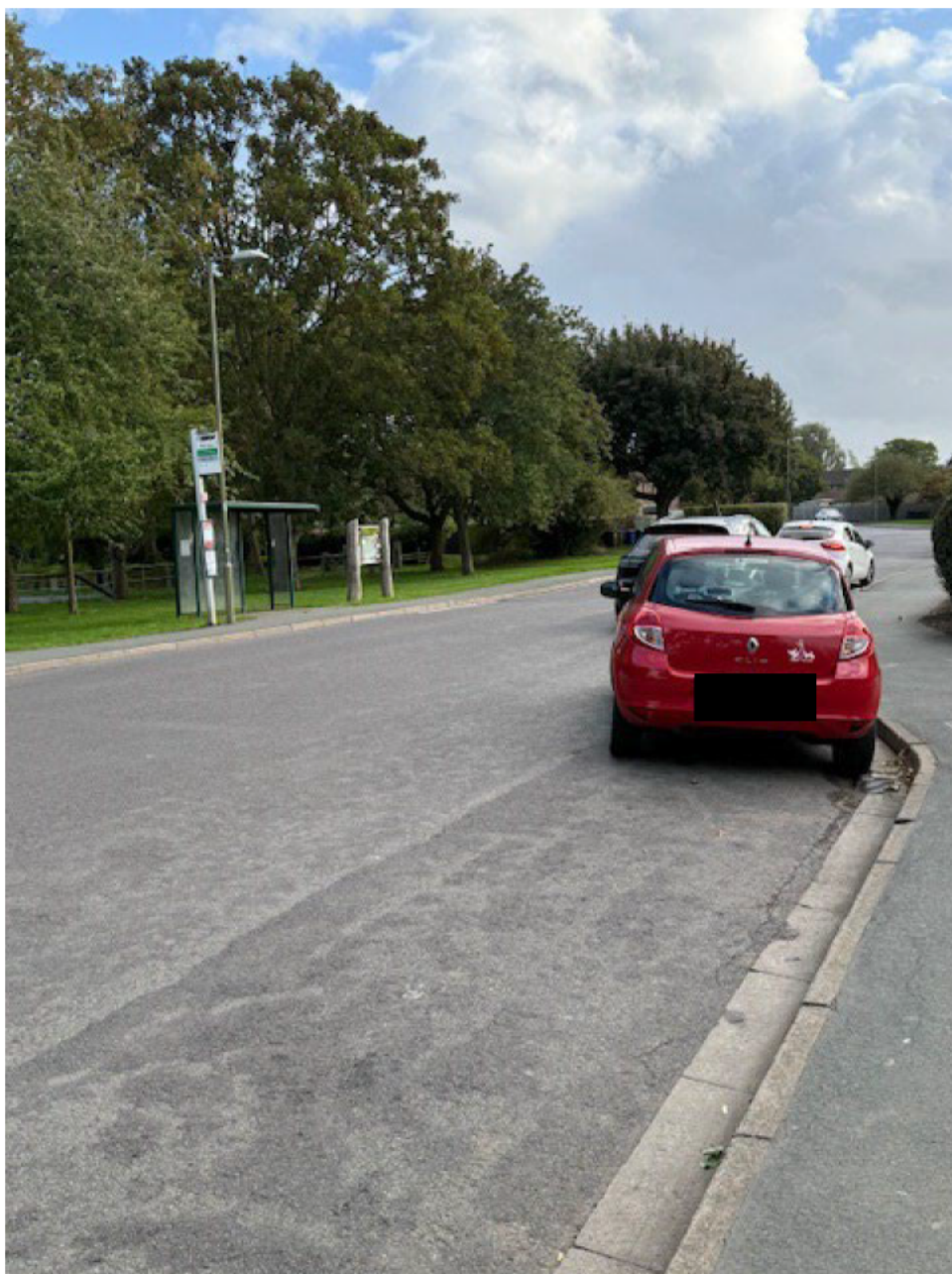

I wish to attend and speak at the above meeting as a local Ward Member for the area.

I note in the report at 4.8 that no objections or responses were received regarding this Licensing Application from the T.V. Police, Environmental Protection Department, Health, Planning, Highways, Bicester Town Council and the Street Scene Department.

I am surprised that Highways have not raised concerns that the Burger Van by its size will dominate the small Lay-by and will overlap onto the busy Shakespeare Drive. This will cause visibility and other highway issues for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists, as well as leading to displacement of parking. The lay by is well used by local residents and motorists for the quick visit to the shops as listed at 3.1 of the report.
