Date	Event
18 October	The Chairman and his consort attended the annual opening of Banbury Fair where they used the power of the 'golden key' to give a free ride to local school children. This was done in conjunction with the Mayor of Banbury and Mr Wilson, the owner of the fair.
19 October	The Chairman and his consort attended the official opening of the new extension to Bicester Village.
21 October	The Chairman and his consort attended the Mayor of Brackley's Trafalgar Night Dinner at Brackley Bowling Club. The event was raising funds for Brackley Sea Cadets.
1 November	In conjunction with Bicester Town Council and Bicester Heritage, the Vice Chairman and her husband attended a guided walking tour of Bicester Heritage, the UK's first business campus dedicated to historic motoring and aviation. This is based at RAF Bicester which is the former WW2 training station.
