Summary

To consider the adoption of the Rousham, Upper Heyford and Lower Heyford Conservation Area Appraisals and Management Plans and their revised boundaries.

Decision

Resolved

- (1) That the revisions to Rousham, Upper Heyford and Lower Heyford Conservation Area boundaries be approved
- (2) That the Rousham, Upper Heyford and Lower Heyford Conservation Area Appraisals and Management Plans be adopted.

Reasons for Decision

Conservation area appraisals are an important way of ensuring that this aspect of policy framework is up-to-date, robust and of the greatest value in the consideration of development proposals within conservation areas.

Up-to-date conservation area appraisals will assist the consideration of planning applications in the areas covered by the appraisal from the point at which they are adopted, and will also assist the implementation of the Cherwell Local Plan.

It is for these reasons that it is recommended that the revisions to the boundaries of Upper Heyford and Lower Heyford be adopted along with the existing boundary for Rousham and the three Conservation Area Appraisals and Management Plans.

Call-in

Notice of call-in must be submitted in writing, by email or text to the Chief Executive by the deadline specified above, and must state the reason or reasons why "call-in" has been requested;

Call-in can be requested by any six non-executive members of the Council.

However, if at any point during a municipal year the total number of opposition councillors is six or less the total number of non-executive members required to call-in a decision shall be the total number of opposition councillors less two.

Decisions not called-in by the deadline specified above will become effective immediately the deadline has expired (unless they are recommendations to the Council).

The Council has stipulated that the call-in procedure should not be used to challenge decisions as a matter of course and should be used only when fully justified.
