#### **Executive Summary**

#### Introduction

- 1.1 On 19 September 2011, the Licensing Authority received an application for the grant of a premises licence to permit provision of Late Night Refreshment and Sale by Retail of Alcohol at Shell Chase, London Road, Bicester.
- 1.2 The Licensing Act 2003 provides a clear focus on the promotion of four statutory objectives which must be addressed when licensing functions are undertaken.
- 1.3 The licensing objectives are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder.
  - Public safety.

- The prevention of public nuisance.
- The protection of children from harm.

The Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

Each objective is of equal importance. It is important to note that there are no other licensing objectives, so that these four objectives are paramount considerations at all times. But the legislation also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work. They include:

- the necessary protection of local residents, whose lives can be blighted by disturbance and anti-social behaviour associated with the behaviour of some people visiting licensed premises of entertainment;
- the introduction of better and more proportionate regulation to give business greater freedom and flexibility to meet customers' expectations;
- greater choice for consumers, including tourists, about where, when and how they spend their leisure time;
- the encouragement of more family friendly premises where younger children can be free to go with the family;
- the further development within communities of our rich culture of live music, dancing and theatre, both in rural areas and in our towns and cities.
- 1.4 For the Licensing Authority to accept a representation as relevant, it must firstly address one or all of the four licensing objectives and the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence upon the promotion of those objectives. The licensing authority must then determine whether or not the representation may be deemed frivolous, vexatious or repetitious and that they have been received within the relevant timescales. The licensing authority can take whole or part of a representation and deem it as relevant, therefore excluding the irrelevant part from the proceedings.
- 1.5 During the consultation period the Licensing Authority received representations from a number of Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties in the vicinity of the premises. Full details of all relevant representations received are included at paragraph 2 of this report.

#### **Proposals**

1.6 The applicant has proposed to provide the following regulated activities for the days and times specified:

#### Late Night Refreshment;

Saturday – Thursday inclusive from 23:00 to 05:00 following morning inclusive

Friday from 23:00 to Midnight inclusive indoors only

#### Sale(by retail) of Alcohol;

Monday – Sunday inclusive from 00:00 to Midnight inclusive (24 hrs) For consumption off the premises only

1.7 The applicant has proposed the following opening hours for the premises:

Monday – Sunday inclusive from 00:00 to Midnight inclusive (24 hrs)

#### **Background Information**

- 2.1 A full copy of the application, including any photos and/or plans of the location to be licensed submitted by the applicant is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 During the consultation period, a total of 9 representations were received in respect of this application. All 9 of these representations have been deemed relevant.
- 2.3 On 20 September 2011, the Licensing Authority received a response to the application from Rob Lowther, Anti Social Behaviour Manager advising they had no objections to the application. A copy of the correspondence is attached at Appendix 2.
- 2.4 On 20 September 2011, the Licensing Authority received a response to the application from Laura Morris, Oxfordshire Licensing Officer with Thames Valley Police advising they had no objections to the application. A copy of the correspondence is attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.5 On 27 September 2011, the Licensing Authority received a response to the application from Trading Standards advising they had no objections to the application. A copy of the correspondence is attached at Appendix 4.
- 2.6 On 12 September 2011 the Licensing Authority received 6 relevant representations from Interested Parties.
- 2.7 All 6 of these Interested Party representations were from the residents of the 6 properties that form Alchester Terrace, London Road, Bicester. The representations were in the form of a single letter signed by the residents of the six properties. A copy of their correspondence is attached at Appendix 5.
- 2.8 A Map showing the location of the premises in relation to the location of the Interested Party properties is attached at Appendix 6.

#### **Key Issues for Consideration/Reasons for Decision and Options**

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 states that all licensing matters must promote the four Licensing Objectives, they are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm
- 3.2 Representations received have stated concerns in relation to potential issues in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.
- 3.3 Details of how the applicant intends to promote the four licensing objectives in general in addition to specifically related to promotion of the prevention of crime and disorder objective and the promotion of the prevention of public nuisance objective is given below:







I have been asked by the occupants of the six houses making up Alchester Terrace to write and state our concerns over the request by the above garage to sell alcohol all through the night.

We are already disturbed on a regular basis by members of the public coming from the town who have had a considerable amount to drink and are either passing our houses to continue down the road towards Langford Village, or turning down the the side of our gardens to take the public footpath to Langford Village.

Our gardens are bombarded with empty bottles, glasses and food packaging and the overall feeling is that it will be considerably worse with the purchasing of alcohol from the Shell garage.


Five out of the twelve persons resident in Alchester Terrace are senior citizens 4 or the 5 being between 75 and 80 years of age and there is great unease over the likelihood of drunken members of the public mistaking the side entrance to our houses and the path to Langford Village. This has occured on a few occasions, the style and age of the houses is such that a right of way exists for the occupants around the whole six houses—there are no fences or gates at the rear of the properties which makes for even more unease.

It is felt that there would be only two main reasons for purchasing alcohol during the night, either to drink in the car, or walk along the streets drinking. It is also felt that the purchasers coming from town could probably well ounder the influence of drink before purchasing more at the garage.

I would ask that consideration be given for our concerns when authorising a licence to sell alcohol all through the night.
