2. Executive Summary

2.1 To consider an objection to the Variation to increase the hours of Late-Night Refreshment, Alcohol Sales and Regulated Entertainment for The White Heart, 4 Sheep Street, Bicester. The variation applied for is to increase the Licensing hours on Friday and Saturday from the current hours of 3am to 4am for Alcohol Sales with 30 minutes drinking up time and 4:30am for Regulated Entertainment. The variation also seeks to amend the conditions in annex 2 of the licence. By removing it in its entirety and replaced with the conditions as set out in part 3 of the variation, see appendix 3.

The consultation period runs for 28 days from ne application is received. This gives Interested esponsible Authorities the opportunity to make s in relation to the application.

The 28 day consultation period ran from the 6 March until the 3 April, 2025. The application has been advertised in accordance with the regulations, with the required Blue Notices being displayed at the premises, photographic evidence of the notices affixed at the premises were received on the 6 March 2025. The Variation was advertised on 13 March 2025 with a Public Notice being placed in the Bicester Advertiser.

During the consultation period 1 objection to the licence variation was received from Thames Valley Police, this was received on the 24 March 2025.

Details of the objection is attached to this report as **Appendix 3**. It should be noted, under section 13(4) of the Act the Licensing Authority may submit objection as one of the responsible authorities.

Environmental Health, Planning, Health Protection, Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service, Oxfordshire Safeguarding Children's Board, Trading Standards, Home Office immigration and the Secretary of State responded with either 'no objections" or "no comments" to make' or did not respond to the consultation.

All information and evidence from the License holder, interested parties, and responsible Authorities will be presented to the committee by the respective parties.

Supporting Information

3. Background

- 3.1 The White Hart is a Public House situated in Bicester at 4 Sheep Street, Bicester OX26 6TB.
- 3.2 The White Hart holds a premises licence (originally issued in 2019 and variation agreed in 2020) which currently allows licensable activities as listed below:

Sale of Alcohol Thursday 10.00 - 0200 (on and off the premises)
Sale of Alcohol Sunday to Thursday 10.00 - 01.00 (on and off the premise)
Sale of Alcohol Friday to Saturday 10.00 – 03.00 (on and off the premises)

Late Night Refreshment (indoors) Sunday 23.00 – 02.00 Late Night Refreshment (indoors) Friday and Saturday 23.00 – 03.00 Late Night Refreshment (indoors) Monday to Thursday 23.00 – 01.30

Regulated Entertainment (indoors) Sunday 10.00 – 01.30 Regulated Entertainment (indoors) Friday and Saturday 10.00 – 03.30 Regulated Entertainment (indoors) Monday to Wednesday 10.00 – 01.00

4. Details

- 4.1 On the 5 March 2025 the Licensing Authority received an application from Spirit Pub Company (Leased) Limited for The White Hart, 4 Sheep Street, Bicester OX26 6TB. The application seeks to vary a premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is recorded under application number 21963. A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1.** A copy of the plan of the premises is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 4.2 The variation application seeks to permit the following extension to the licensing hours:

The hours applied for are as follows:

Opening Hours Friday – Saturday 09:00 – 04:30 Sale of Alcohol (on and off sales) Friday - Saturday 10:00 – 04:00 Regulated Entertainment Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30 Late Night Refreshment Friday – Saturday 23:00 – 04:00

The opening hours shall also be extended to allow for 30 minutes drinking up time, meaning the pub will close at 4:30am.

The variation also seeks to amend the conditions in annex 2 of the licence. By removing it in its entirety and replaced with the conditions as set out in part 3 of the variation, see appendix 3.

- 4.3 The application was validated on the 5 March and the consultation process began on the 6 March and ran until 3 April 2025.
- 4.4 A hearing was arranged on the 15 April 2025 in accordance with Schedule 1 of The Licencing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 4.5 Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are asked to determine the application as the Licensing Authority has received a representation stating that the grant of this application would undermine the prevention of crime and disorder, and public safety licensing objectives.
- 4.6 The Licensing Authority may only consider aspects relevant to the application that have been raised in the representation.
- 4.7 Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are requested to determine the application having regard to the operating schedule, representations received, the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy, revised guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the four licensing objectives.
- 4.8 An authorisation is required in respect of any premises where it is intended to conduct one or more of the licensable activities, these being:
 - (a) Sale of alcohol
 - (b) Supply of alcohol (in respect of a club)

- (c) Regulated Entertainment
- (d) Provision of Late Night Refreshment

An appropriate authorisation is either, a premises licence, a club premises certificate, or a Temporary Event Notice.

4.9 Licence holders are required, when offering any licensable activity, to ensure that they promote the licensing objectives at all times. The operating schedule of the application contains detail of all the activities applied for and the control measures that the applicant will have in place in order to promote these objectives. Such measures will, where appropriate be converted into enforceable conditions on any licence issued.

The four licensing objectives are:

- (a) Prevention of crime and disorder
- (b) Prevention of public nuisance
- (c) Public Safety
- (d) Protection of children from harm.
- 4.10 Where representations have been received from a responsible authority or any other person, and the concerns have not been resolved through mediation between all parties, the Licensing Act 2003 requires that these applications should be determined by the Licensing Authority's Licensing Committee. The Licensing Act 2003 allows for applications such as this one to be delegated to a Sub-Committee. In accordance with those rules, the Scheme of Delegation set out in the Council's Constitution states that the Licensing Sub-Committee has responsibility for dealing with this application.

5. Alternative Options and Reasons for Rejection

- 5.1 At the end of the consultation period the licensing authority must hold a hearing if relevant representations are received. It must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm
- 5.2 The steps the Sub-Committee can take are to:
 - issue the licence as applied for;
 - issue the licence with amended hours or licensable activities
 - reject the application if it is considered necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory Conditions

All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

- No Supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence -
- a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
- b) At a time when then the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence
- 3.1 The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- 3.2 In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
- i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available
- 5.1 The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 5.3 The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
- a. a holographic mark or
- b. an ultraviolet feature
- The responsible person must ensure that -
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-
- i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
- ii. gin, rum, vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35ml; and
- iii. still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P=D+(DxV)

Where: -

- i. P is the permitted price
- ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of alcohol, and
- iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- i. The holder of the premises licence
- ii. The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- iii. The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e. "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.1 Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
- 4.2 The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

If the Premises Licence allows Exhibition of Films

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.

3.Where

- (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4. In this section "children" means any person aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
- (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
- (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

General - all four licensing objectives

We have applied for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises to give us the option to allow for a more gradual dispersal of customers. The style and operation of the pub will not differ significantly during the extended hours. Where this is appropriate, non-alcoholic refreshment will be available in the extended period.

The premises will respect Spirit Group's Approach to Responsible Drinking (a copy of which was enclosed in support of this application). Out policies change at regular intervals to reflect current trends and it would be inappropriate to standardise them on a permanent basis. The enclosed policy is included for information only and not as suggested conditions or to form part of any other Operating Schedule.

The prevention of crime and disorder

When door staff are used they will be Security Industry Authority (SIA) approved and operate in accordance with the security industry guidelines.

A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times.

If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she will ask customers to leave quietly.

If a CCTV system is installed at this site, it will continue to operate during the additional hours of trading and notices will be displayed.

All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.

Public Safety

Public safety is integral to the way that the Spirit Group runs its business and is reviewed regularly through our health and safety policy. This policy is fully briefed and trained to all management and staff and we will continue to train our staff to the standards required by relevant legislation. Free drinking water will be available at all times.

The prevention of public nuisance

Additional patrols will take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.

If appropriate, notices will be displayed asking our customers to respect our neighbours when leaving the premises.

Where already used text/radio pagers will continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available if we decide to use the option to stay open for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises (see above under General).

All external doors/windows must be kept closed other than for access and egress in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

No licensable activities or consumption of alcohol will take place externally after 23:00.

The protection of children from harm


When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for young persons. Children will be required to be supervised by the accompanying adult at all time.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks will be available. A recognised Proof of Age Policy will be enforced. Page 15





Thames Valley Police Objection to a full variation application

As licensing officer for Thames Valley Police, I am authorised to make representation in relation to applications and notifications submitted under the Licensing Act 2003 on behalf of the Chief Constable as a responsible authority

I am writing to formally present Thames Valley Police's objection against the application by the Spirit Pub Company Ltd, for a Full Variation submitted on Thursday 6th March 2025 to extend the licensable activities at the White Hart, 4 Sheep Street, Bicester, OX26 6TB on Friday and Saturday nights.

Proposed Variation for Friday and Saturdays

- To extend the Sale of alcohol a until 04:00hrs and then a 30 minute drinking up time until 04:30hrs.
- Late Night Refreshment until 04:00hrs.
- Regulated Entertainment until 04:30hrs.
- Closing time 04:30hrs.

Current Operation

- Sale of alcohol until 03:00hrs.
- Late Night refreshment until 03:00hrs.
- Regulated Entertainment until 03:30hrs
- Closing time 03:30hrs.

The premises

The White Hart like any other premise in the town suffers from incidents throughout the year, these are connected both within and immediately outside. Some incidents in the town centre can be identified with customers from the White Hart. As can be seen from the list below the premise has been associated with 13 incidents that have been reported to the police in the last 12 months. Some inside some directly outside and others associated with White Hart customers in the town.

The list shows both positive and negative side of the way the premise is run. As can be seen most incidents are reported at or very near the closing time of the premise now to extend the hours would only be to extend the incident times. Some of the incidents show good work by door staff in refusing drunk customers entry, if the hours to extend were granted then customers from other venues would want as they do now attempt to get into the premise.

- 1. Saturday 21st December 2024 at 01:10hrs Sexual assault in the premises.
- 2. Saturday 1st December 2024 at 03:30hrs Assault outside the premises.
- 3. Saturday 2nd November 2024 at 00:30hrs Sexual assault in the premises.
- 4. Friday 11th October 2024 at 03:04hrs Fight and assault outside the premises.

- 5. Sunday 1st September 2024 at 01:43hrs Barred male entered the premises and was removed by door staff, the male attempted to assault the staff.
- 6. Sunday 18th August 2024 at 18:00hrs Male refused service as he was too intoxicated, he then caused disorder and tried to assault staff.
- 7. Sunday 4th August 2024 at 00:43hrs large group of travellers figting inside and outside the premises.
- 8. Saturday 25th May 2024 at 01:40hrs Male ejected from the premises and was trying to re-enter and was causing disorder.
- 9. Friday 15th May 2024 at 02:21hrs Male assaulted inside the premises.
- 10. Sunday 7th April 2024 at 01:44hrs Intoxicated male removed from the premises and was causing problems outside with the door staff.
- 11. Saturday 30th March 2024 at 02:40hrs Serious assault by a doorman assaulting a customer with a knuckle duster.
- 12. Saturday 30th March 2024 at 02:16hrs Female assaulted by a male in the premises.
- 13. Saturday 30th March 2024 at 03:18hrs Male who had previously be refused entry seen by officers approaching the the premises swinging a baseball bat.

Police concerns

The White Hart currently closes at 03:30hrs on Friday and Saturdays and is the last premises in Bicester to close on these days. Both the Local Policing Team Inspector and Sergeant state that the White Hart is where most of the incidents occur in the town and normally around closing time. They also feel that policing response to Nightsafe only provides an overlap and additional resources for the Night Time Economy until 04:00hrs and a later closing would have a significant impact on the effectiveness of the police response and public safety.

Thames Valley Police are objecting to this application as they believe that there is a high risk that there will an increase in crime and ASB in the area which may undermine the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public safety Objectives.
