Graven Hill – work on the case for locating the Fulfilment Centre to C Site is progressing and "Destination Bicester – Fulfilment Centre support document" was tabled and Cherwell continues to promote Bicester. The outcome of the case will be known at the end 2014. Promotion of Bicester – The team continues to promote Bicester, including at the Pioneer Square one year celebration 12 and 13 July; Annual Bicester Bike Day 30 August; Oxfordshire Goes Wild 13 September. A Disruptive Innovation Festival 2014 is being launched later in the year by the The Ellen MacArthur Foundation. The Festival will give an opportunity to look at the circular economy, upcycling and recycling. It is proposed to run an Eco Bicester disruptive innovative event after the next Board meeting in October. The Chairman drew members' attention to the tabled document and advised the other site being considered is Donnington (Telford & Wrekin Council).	
4.	NW Steering Group Progress Report	Jenny Barker updated the Board on the tabled paper which sets out the progress on the development at NW Bicester. Exemplar - planning permission was approved in 2012 and clearance of conditions and compliance with the legal agreement is ongoing. Highway works started in May to gain access to the site which has caused some traffic issues and measures have since been put in place to alleviate the problems. The first residential properties are due in 2015. Eco Business Centre – discussions progressing and an update report will be brought to the October Board meeting.	
		Primary school – good progress made with the design and competition for the potential school operators. Masterplan – being led by A2Dominion. Supporting documents have been submitted to Cherwell District Council and consultation comments (which close today, 24 July) on these documents along with key elements of the Masterplan will inform a Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). Three further proposals by A2Dominion are also being worked on and are expected end July and these are	

		detailed in the tabled A4 map.		
		Albion Land met with CDC in July for formal pre-application advice on land they control in the South East corner, also shown on the map and an application is also expected end July.		
		The Chairman advised the Board that it was not possible to formally adopt the SPD until the Local Plan has been adopted. The SPD will be submitted to CDC's Executive Committee at the end of the year for formal adoption as a planning document.		
		Cllr Waine raised the realignment of Howes Lane and the downgrading of the road. Jenny Barker advised that discussions are ongoing and there is a Member sustainable transport meeting on 23 September which will also include modal shift.

It is a joint venture between BioRegional and Oxford Brookes and to date approx. £3m research funding has been awarded to the town from the Technology Strategy Board and the Department of Energy and Climate Change (DECC). A dedicated website has been created www.bicesterlivinglab.org and provides a background on the project, news and event details. Next steps include looking for seed funding to enhance		
		the web presence, enable further events, promotional activities and have a		

		physical presence in the town.	
		The Chairman and Board endorsed the Living Lab programme and advised Board Members would contact the Living Lab group separately with regard to individual support.	
		Cllr Mould advised all that they are welcome to visit the Garth and see the retrofitting work that has been carried out with the Technology Strategy Board funding.	
		Jenny Barker presented the update report on wider Bicester strategic sites along with the Bicester Development Proposals map and table of major sites with planning permission.	
		Policy development – the Local Plan examination was suspended in June 2014 until December 2014 to enable the housing need for the District, identified in the recently published Oxfordshire Housing Market Assessment, to be addressed through modifications to the Plan. It was anticipated this would be met by looking at the rates of delivery, sites identified in the SHLAA and any additional capacity that can be achieved. The modifications to the Local Plan will go to consultation from 22 August - 3 October 2014.
