To date the Discovery Walk has not increased footfall and this is being explored with companies as to why not. Will engage with stakeholders on whether to make it permanent.</li> <li>Community activation – very successful B2B (Business to Business) event which was a joint initiative with 2B's Management Consultancy and Bicester Vision. Well attended by health and wellbeing businesses. Cookery skills classes supported by Tesco and held at the Salvation Army. Currently collecting evidence, shown in the media report at Appendix A, but initial feedback shows that these activities take time to become established. Outcomes to be bought to the next meeting. The student volunteer fayre to raise awareness of volunteering opportunities in the town, CV and work experience advice and opportunity for the voluntary sector to find volunteers, was attended by 150 students and is now in the activity plan to be held annually.</li> <li>New models of care – work ongoing looking at opportunities for a site for primary care facilities. The Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is keen to engage with</li> </ul>

		councillors and primary care in November 2018. Very successful diabetes education event held which bought together groups to show how people can help themselves. 76 people attended. In active discussion with Public Health, OCC and CDC to sustain the programme after March and spread the approach to other towns and counties. Comments from the Board  Cllr Lawrie Stratford advised lessons from the Bicester HNT Programme and Barton Healthy New Town were shared at an OCC Cabinet meeting. Cllr Stratford offered to work with the HNT Programme Manager (HNT PM) to widen the knowledge learned and encourage others. The HNT Programme Manager thanked Cllr Stratford and advised the	
		Board that there are also HNT Ambassadors from the schools to promote the activities and will work to promote this over the next 6 months.	
		Cllr Richard Mould advised Bicester School had agreed to take on a nurse. Following on from the under 11's health article in the Garth Gazette, an article for the 0-5 age group will be included in the next issue.
