

Recruitment

- 80K to train a Police Officer
- Face to Face interviews reintroduced 20% of applicants have not got through
- 48% of our new recruits are female.
- 26 intakes of new recruits 23/24
- 774 Officers recruited into TVP during the 2022 uplift
- New pathways for ex-military





Force Review Update

- Biggest review and restructure of our force since 2010. We are now working in more complex environment, with growing demand and with greater focus on vulnerability and online crime and prevention. Our force structure needs to reflect these changes and meet demand.
- Force review has identified £15.7m of savings. £7m of these savings have been delivered to date.





Force Review Update

- New structure allows us to surge resources to meet demand.
- Buckinghamshire Local Command Unit went live in April 2024, Oxford will go live November 2024 with Berkshire East and Berkshire following in May 2025.
- New model has better levels of local scrutiny and public oversight through the establishment of LCU Community Scrutiny Panels as well as staying true to the commitments of our Race Action Plan with the revision of LCU Independent Advisory Groups.

Neighbourhood Policing

- Op Purchase Increased patrols and collaboration with businesses to focus on reducing retail crime by addressing areas of prevention, enforcement and key areas of demand.
 - 566 business premises registered to DISC a self crime management system, allowing businesses to directly report crime and intelligence.
 - Creation of "Fight Back Against Retail Crime" events, over
 70 retailers attending per event.
 - **•** Overall charge volume increased by 10%.


Neighbourhood Policing

- Thames Valley Alerts We now have over 107,000 users, with 269 extra users added just in December alone and over 586,000 total messages. We've seen 44,520 alert interactions and overall 57.37% overall engagement
- E-scooters/E-Bikes focus Force focus on addressing this issue.
 - SPOCS assigned within Roads Policing & Local Policing Areas.
 - Exploring use of Selecta DNA sprays to tag vehicles and purpertriors of two wheeled crime.
 - Ongoing engagement with public and schools to educate on legality and risks.
 - Improved capturing of performance data, providing a more detailed and accurate picture.
 - 31 E bikes/scooters seized in Jan 25. 16 seized in Oxford LCU, highest in TVP.

Contact Management and Digital 101

Our Goals:

- Reduce the yearly average time to answer 101 calls to 5 minutes
- Reduce negative abandonment rate for 101 calls
- Ensure 90% of 999 calls are answered within 10 seconds



Innovation and use of technology means we are managing demand better but it is not costing us more!

Future Innovation

- Speech and text analytics Software to better understand and manage our demand – March 2025
- AI Chabot's to handle non-emergency requests These can assist in reporting minor crimes or providing information to the public, freeing up resources to focus on demand. – May 2025

Rural Crime

- TVP Rural Crime Taskforce is increasing in size in October to 3 Sgts and 21 PC's, this will give coverage of 7 days a week 0800hrs till 0200hrs.
- SEPARC South East Partnership Against Rural Crime is Kent, Sussex, Surrey, Hampshire and Thames Valley. We are working together on joint operations tackling Rural Crime. This includes operations at Dover Docks checking Plant/Farm Machinery being taken out of the country.
- Footprint of thefts in TVP goes to a worldwide market, including large generators being sent to the Ukraine and tractor GPS system to USA
- TVP no recognised as blueprint on how to tackle Rural Crime.
- Close working relationship with NFU and CLA meaning the Rural Community has a voice at all times.
- Reported Hare Coursing has drop for 3 yrs. in a row .
- Numerous covert operations being carried out to identify the trade routes of stolen Plant/Farm machinery to bring the handlers to justice.



Line plot shows Force fatal's from baseline year, column plot shows lives saved due to casualty reduction efforts from baseline year.


Thames Valley - 10 Year Casualty Reduction Comparison - 2014 - 2023 - Went live with SOH in Jan 18 **








## Oxfordshire

- Merger into Oxfordshire Local Command Unit (LCU) -This took place in November 2024. No drop in countywide performance.
- Harm Reduction New harm reduction unit working with partners to focus on the most vulnerable and those who commit the most harm in communities.
- **Proactivity –** County-wide proactive team targeting county lines and organised crime.
- Neighbourhoods Neighborhoods guarantee ASB, Retail and town centre crime
- **Partnerships** Dedicated partnership SMT member to ensure strategic partnerships are maintained and enhanced.





## Oxfordshire

#### **County-wide performance priorities**

**Respond to the public –** To improve our attendance times for emergency calls – both Grade 1 and Grade 2 calls.

**Bring offenders to justice –** To increase the number of offenders charged or brought to justice through out of court resolutions.

**Serve victims** – To increase victim satisfaction focusing on the victim experience throughout the investigation process.
